**Courteous Law Enforcement** 

Police Chief Howard W. Gillette is to be admired for the instructions he issued his department follow-ing his reappointment by the new city administra-tion. We particularly like the following portion of his statement:

"Every man in this department will be re-"Every man in this department will be re-quired to conduct himself in such a way as to de-serve the respect of the citizens of Twin Falls. His actions must be governed by the law of com-mon sense; he must be courteous at all times but never apologetic; he will be required to be honest in every respect; he must have a strong enough character to withstand the temptations that come to every police officer. He must be loyal to his fellow officers, the department and the adminis-tration." tration."

fellow officers, the department and the adminis-tration." This type of law enforcement has won respect for the Twin Falls police department under the direction of Chief Gillette, and his reappointment no doubt meets with hearty approval. He is deserving of much redit, for he has demonstrated that law can be en-forced just as effectively with a courteous police force. Public admiration for this courteousness brings the voluntary co-operation so necessary for preserva-tion of law and order.. By contrast we are reminded of an incident ser-frail years ago when a stream of cars was returning to Twin Falls from the Filer fairgrounds. One of these motorists, driving at a reasonable rate of speed, passed several cars ahead of him when the oppor-tunity presented itself. You can imagine his chagrin and resentment when a state traffic officer who ap-parently had been assigned to this district on special duty, crowded him to the edge of the highway and, with a rat-terrier snarl and Newfoundland growl, proceeded to tear off the innocent driver's skin and scatter it all over U. S. 30. Then, after the officer hàd laid his victim low, he continued down the road twice as fast, passing every car in sight. Through the rear window of the official car could be seen a woman, presumably the offlier's wife, and that served to explain the whole affair. In her presence, the patrolman no doubt became imbued with importance, and in his bellowing chest there beat the satisfaction that comes from rugged conquest. We are more inclined to admire the type of polic-ing that will result from Chief Gillette's adminition: "Do not think that because you carry a badge you are the law of the land. You are the representative of that aw and the servant of the court. A police of-ficer is no better than the amount of co-operation he can get from the public.""

#### "Devil Dan's" Reward

"Devil Dan's" Reward The administration seems to have swung complete-ly around the circle in its attitude toward monopolies. The president's current insistence that the anti-trust laws be overhauled and strengthened, his refusal to approve the Tydings bill to legalize contracts to main-tain prices, and the suit against the aluminum com-bine—all these things offer a sharp contrast to the early history of the administration. For in the early days the White House seemed to have little fear of monopoly. Perhaps the most potent of all the objections to the way the NRA worked out was the charge that it fostered monopoly and left the consumer at the mercy of the "big fellows." The Sher-man anti-trust law got so that it looked like an ex-tremely dead letter.

In the Boxer rebellion he held a bastion single-handed against a horde of yellow men jin Hait he rodued a detachment of Cacos; in one of the hottest engagements of the World war, single handed, he captured a machine gin nest and 14 of the enemy.

All this valor won him a hatful of medals—but when he returned to private life he had a hard time getting a job, finally landed one as bank nightwatch-män, and when he died of heart disease the other day, was practically penniless. If American's will study the story of "Devil Dan" and learn how poorly glory pays, it may be still easier for us to keep out of the next war.
