Sick Pheasants or Politics?

Judging from all the smoke that continues to "fog up" over State Game Warden McIntyre's recent dismissal of Jim Marshall as head of the state game farm at Jerome, there is reason to suspect more political fire in the making than even the warden would care to admit.

News just emanating from the state game department at Boise "reveals" that an inspection at these farms by the bureau of animal industry "has disclosed the fact that tuberculosis, parasites and dietary troubles have been allowed to run unchecked for months. (Obviously that puts the blame on Mr. Marshall's shoulders.) The statement was attributed to Dr. T. A. Elliot in a letter to the state game warden. Elliot was careful to add that "management" was partially responsible for the "tubercular condition" of the pheasants. Just in case that wouldn't make it look bad enough for Marshall, the state game warden was quick to explain (even at this late date) that "the conditions claimed by Elliot are just one more reason for some recent changes we have made."

Marshall has flatly denied all these charges and there are experts who stand ready to bear him out. Many sportsmen and others interested in fair play are rallying to Marshall's support. As a result it appears that the game department of Idaho, already accused many times of being a political job bureau, is fast approaching the point of being forced into an embarrassing showdown.

Since the game dependment chooses to keen its "neck bowed" in an apparent attempt to crucify Marshall, perhaps it would be advisable to have a thorough investigation of the whole affair—an investigation divorced entirely from politics. There are several questions that might bring forth enlightening answers. Was Marshall dismissed for good reasons, or ousted on trumped up charges?
