



Drivers' License-For What?

Undoubtedly the Idaho drivers' license act was designed to promote safety on our highways, principally by denying those physically unfit the right to operate a motor vehicle.

Poor eyesight and defective hearing would ordinarily be considered good reasons for questioning an individual's right to have a driver's license, that is if a driver's license means anything. Those addicted to drunkeness, it would seem, could not get a license under any consideration.

But to all indications the Idaho drivers' license But to all indications the Idaho drivers' license amounts to nothing more than just another excuse for collecting taxes. Outside of its value as a means of identification in case of accident, there is little it accomplishes along the lines for which it was originally

complishes along the lines for which it was originally intended.

For the past several weeks up until the first of the month, the drivers' license counter in the courthouse was thronged with those filling out their applications. To watch the routine was interesting. Some mumbled to themselves about questions they didn't fully understand. Others threw down their fifty cents as if buying a theater ticket. A few would smile knowingly as they observed some applicant whom they knew had a physical defect that should at least raise a question under the circumstances.

As it is, the drivers' license is no test of an individual's ability to operate a car. The application blank is filled out by the applicant himself. If the one seeking a license is deaf, he doesn't say so, and if he's a drunkard, he doesn't admit it. The one in charge of the deak gives the applicant a fleeting glance to make sure his eyes are blue and his hair brown, gives him a slip, takes the fifty cents—and the license requirements have been fulfilled.

This is not intended as a criticism of anyone. If each one of these applicants were to be given a thorough test it would take an army of expiniers and the

ach one of these applicants were to be given a thor-ough test it would take an army of examiners and the individual 50 cent fee would hardly cover expenses. But it does demonstrate how we muddle around with state laws that absolutely fail of their purpose, but yet serve as an excuse to exact more and more

A genuine drivers' license, embodying all that the A genuine drivers' license, embodying all that the name implies, is a good thing for any state. Those physically and mentally unfit and morally irresponsible should not be sllowed to drive, and a real drivers' license would serve to keep them off the highways. But that's something entirely different from the drivers' license as we know it in Idaho.

Wages of a Genius

He simply didn't ask one. He was one of those rare souls without the slightest interest in money. He deserves remembrance almost as much for his selfless devotion to his work as for his genius as a scientist and an inventor.

Required Reading

No part of a dictatorship looks funnier, to inhabitants of a democracy, than its newspapers. And one of the funniest developments of all comes from Berlin, where a law journal suggests that under Nazi law it may be a misdemeanor to fail to read the daily papers. It seems that in a vast number of trials, witnesses and defendants have pleaded ignorance of some Nazi rule or edict because they hadn't been, reading the papers. The courts have got fed up with this, and are instructing all such persons to mend their ways instanter.

What inducement is there to read the newspapers, in a land where every journal is under the thumb of a government ministry of propaganda, where all the news is filtered and colored and no writer dare disagree with the dictator? If you are going to have that kind of newspapers, you might as well have a law enforcing people to read them; for otherwise a constantly increasing part of the populace is apt to leave them entirely alone.




