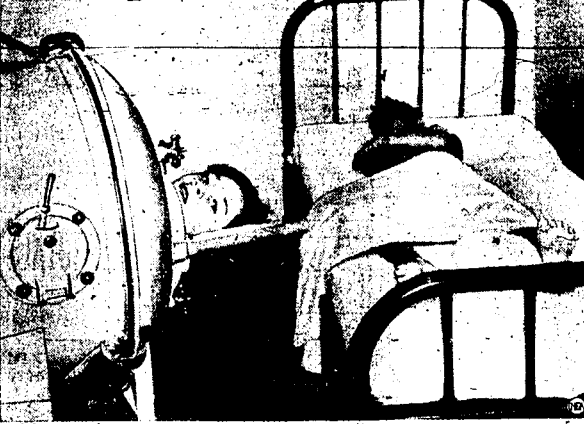
TRIO DIES UNDER DAM LANDSLIDE
