

MUSSOLINI LEAVES FOR 4-DAY VISIT WITH HITLER

Parley Intended to Show United Front

 ROME, Sept. 24 (UP)—Premier Benito Mussolini, head of Fascist Italy, left by special train at 12:20 p. m. today (4:20 a. m. MST) for a four-day visit with Fuehrer Adolf Hitler, German Nazi chieftain—a visit intended to show the world that the dictators are united against any who oppose either.
 Thousands of Fascist workers, with hands, stood with Hitler at the railroad station to cheer Mussolini. Soldiers and Fascist militiamen presented arms and played the national and Fascist anthems. Airplanes flew overhead as the train left. Officials estimated at 100,000 the crowd that bade Mussolini farewell.
 He is to arrive at Munich tomorrow, leave there tomorrow night to attend the big German army maneuvers on the Baltic coast, arrive in Berlin Monday, meet a fellow-speaker with Hitler at the Olympic stadium Tuesday, and leave Wednesday.

 Mussolini selected this retinue to accompany him: Count Galeazzo Ciano, his son-in-law and foreign minister; Achille Starace, secretary general of the Fascist party; Dino Alfieri, minister of press and propaganda (called now minister of popular culture); and his private secretary, Osvaldo Sebastiani.
 Tomorrow is to be a holiday in Munich in his honor. Tuesday is to be a holiday in Berlin. There are to be triumphal processions and a great military parade.
 Everything has been done to show here and at Berlin that this is a meeting of political cousins, particularly united against Bolshevism. It is to be a further strengthening of the "Berlin-Rome axis" of cooperation.

The navy department admitted that the policy may mean that naval forces will at times be exposed to danger but said: "These risks must be accepted."

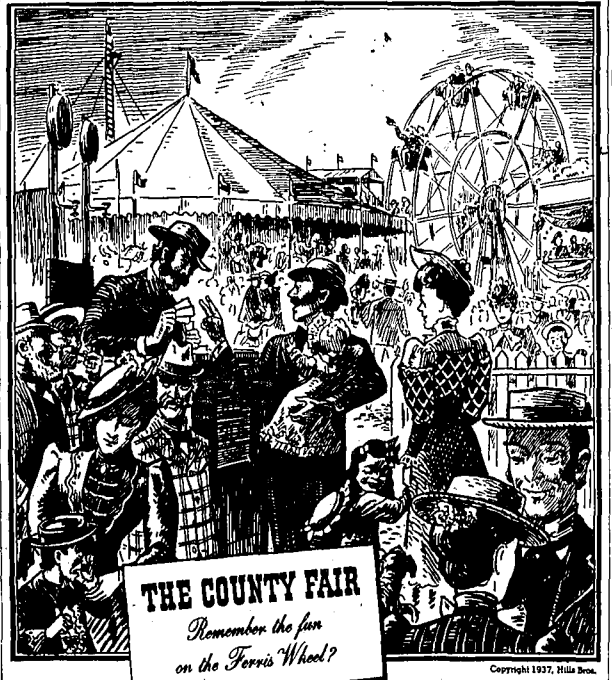
Mounties Get Man, But Capture Takes Over Two Seasons

SENIORS SELECT 'DEATH HOLIDAY'

Tryouts Start Oct. 6 For Nolo Drama Picked By Upper Class

Village of Mackay Offers to House, Feed State Road Head

BOISE, Ida., Sept. 24 (UP)—While the village of Mackay offered to house and feed Joe Stemmer, director of highways, until he gets a paycheck, the state road engineers today reiterated his determination to stay in office until full settlement of legal red tape and a highway audit.

The Mackay Community club, at a recent barbecue, passed a resolution and sent copies to Stemmer's attorney, W. Taylor and President Roosevelt—offering to house the road builder and feed him until the state of Idaho begins paying him.

Stemmer's check has been held since January because of

an Easter suit—later dlambed—and a judgment finding him and the Bunting Tractor corporation responsible to the state for approximately \$14,000 expended in allegedly illegal purchase of machinery.

The case will probably go to the state supreme court.

Stemmer said, "I don't know how long I can live while working for nothing, but I'm going to stay here until everything is settled—that is, as long as possible."

An audit of the highway department, first chapter of which purportedly showed irregularities on one contract, is near completion.

Idaho's Assets in Loan Units Grow

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24 (Special)—Assets of the eight federal savings and loan associations in Idaho increased from \$4,553,123 to \$4,294,227, or \$258,896, in the first eight months of this year, it was reported today by the Federal Home Loan Bank board.

During the same period, one state-chartered savings and loan association which has its savings accounts protected up to \$5,000 each by the Federal Savings and Loan insurance corporation increased its assets \$93,848. This made a total increase of \$642,745 in the assets of associations, both federal and state-chartered, which provide this protection for savings in Idaho. All federal associations must provide this insurance.

Savings invested in the total of nine associations increased \$32,243 during the eight-month period.
