Hermann Goering's pet newspaper announces that German-blood citizens of other countries must now become agents of the Nazi social and economic program. They must abandon "un-German" points of view, accept the Nazi ide-ology and be prepared to "undergo all sacrifices and accept full responsibility" in the present struggle of the German nation. This, of course, is nothing less than a demand that all Germans living is countries like the United States must automatically hyphenate themselves. They must abroad. They must dilute their new citizenship, and be prepared constantly to sell out the land of their adoption on orders from Berlin.
