### Seriously Injured FRENCH VESSELS IN SPAIN PATROL -In War Games EIGHT OF 11 VICTIMS **RECOVERED FROM SEA**

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Feb. 3 (U.B.—A blinding rain squall was blamed by the navy today for the last night's air dis-aster in which II men were killed when two giant navy bombers crashed head-on during war games 70 miles off shore. Three other men had miraculous escapes but suffered earlous injuries

serious injuries. The navy announced the three men saved themselves by parachute leaps.
