

It heard the issue experts—architects, engineers, financiers and so on—and then it called Mrs. Anna Schier, to tell about the human side of the picture.

For a number of years she and her husband and two daughters occupied a flat in a dilapidated old building which was about as uncomfortable a place as people ever tried to call home. 
