Of Old Claim for \$85,000 Leader Taunts England For Big Debt Owed U.S.

MEXICO CITY, May 14 (U.P.—Mexico, angered by Great Britain's methods of demanding a claims annuity of \$85,000, suspended diplomatic relations with the British government today and taunted it with failing to pay its own gigantic

President Lazaro Cardenas recalled Primo Villa Michel, Mexican minister at London, and the legation personnel, and ordered the legation closed indefinitely. Foreign Minister Eduardo Hay, handed Owen SL. C. O'Malley, the British min-ister, a check for \$85,000 and, in a note informing him of the President's action, said: "May I be allowed, however, to call your excellency's at-tention to the fact that not even powerful states with ample resources at their disposal can boast of having fullied their-monetary obligations?"
