

The cutting of steel prices is apparently an effort to do something to get things off dead cen-ter, rather than supinely waiting for something to turn up. turn up.

Live sales organizations everywhere are beginning to realize that sales can be made if advertising is well-used and greater aggressiveness and imagination used in seek-


