It is becoming ap-parent that the bridge purchase probably will be up to the legislature. For that reason Twin Falls county voters should nay narticular attention to the legislative ticket—in

For that reason 1 win Fails county voters should pay particular attention to the legislative ticket—in-order to make absolutely certain that those legisla-tors nominated Tuesday are not only unqualifiedly in favor of the bridge purchase but will battle de-terminedly for success. A mere "yes" vote on a bridge measure is not enough. The county's legislators must battle ag unit. battle as a unit. The community as a whole must nominate Tuesday

That \$408,500 "Value" Again

Once more crops up, from the lips of Ira H. Masters, that \$408,500 "estimate" of the value of the Twin

Falls-Jerome Intercounty bridge. In his address here Tuesday night, Mr. Masters again stuck to the only "defense" he has yet brought forward in blocking the bridge transaction approved by Gov. Barzilla Clark and Public Works Commis-sioner Alan Merritt, Merritt and his subordinate, J. H. Stemmer Ata Merrit, Merrit and insubordinate, J. H. Stemmer, state highway director, both approved as equitable the \$647,000 price agreed upon with the brought forth a claim that \$408,500 should be the figure, although neither Masters, J. W. Taylor nor Stemmer has ever justified that total with concrete figures.

Stemmer has ever justified that total with concrete figures. Masters attempts weakly to shift the burden to the Twin Falls bridge committee. He said: "There seems to be some strange reason why the committee insists on this particular (\$647,000) contract." That's simply clouding the issue. The Twin Falls committee does not insist on any particular contract or price. The \$647,000 figure was arrived at by the governor, Merritt, Stemmer and the bridge company. The Twin Falls committee claimed no legal status at those conferences and merely "sat in." What Twin Falls and south Idaho want is removal of the bridge tolls—which form an out-dated barrier to the flow of Idaho highway traffic. The General Construction company appraisal ap-parently justified the \$647,000 figure as fair. The state's "independent" appraisal by the federal bureau of highways has not been submitted. Obviously, it will not be until after the primary election. That's the rub.
