RAIL OFFICIALS AWAIT PROBE ON COAST'S WORST CRASH

DEATH TOLL HTS 11 AND INJURED 111 IN ACCIDENT

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 21 (AP)—Southern Pacific railroad officials here today were awaiting word from the coast regarding the crash of a passenger train yesterday.

J. H. Dyer, vice president of the Southern Pacific and a passenger on the California when it was struck by the Argonaut, said Jacobson muttered over and over again: "I'm not crazy but I don't know why I did it."

The death toll from the crash stood at 11. Four of the 11 persons injured were in critical condition in Los Angeles, Calif., hospital.

It was the worst train wreck in the west since the Olympic jumping into a Montana creek, killing 44 passengers, and trainmen and injuring 67.

Deputy coroner Herbert Hughes said the August 20 crash was the worst in the history of the railroad.

Results of the voting in other states yesterday were as follows:

NEW JERSEY—Republicans nominated Governor Warren G. Harding by a vote of 100,000 to 90,000. Democrats nominated William H. J. Myer, unopposed. Eleven of 14 incumbent congressmen sought re-election, only one was opposed.

WISCONSIN—Gov. Philip F. La Follette was re-nominated to an unprecedented fourth term by his party. National Progressives of America, His opponent, Edwin Turner, Socialist, got small protest vote as a result of La Follette's break with Milwaukee Socialists. Robert K. Henry and Julius P. Hall were running close race for Republican gubernatorial nomination, and Henry was leading Jerome Fox for the Democratic nomination. Sen. P. Ryan Duffy, D., praised by President Roosevelt for his loyalty to the New Deal, was unopposed for re-nomination. Alexander Wiley was leading John B. Chapple in Republican senatorial race.

MASSACHUSETTS—Democrats nominated James M. Curley for governor. A former governor, 63 years old, he defeated three opponents including Gov. Charles F. Hurley and Lieut. Gov. Francis A. Kelly. Everett R. Ballantine, former house speaker, won the Republican gubernatorial nomination. Incomplete returns indicated that all 13 Massachusetts congressmen—10 Republicans and five Democrats—had been re-nominated.

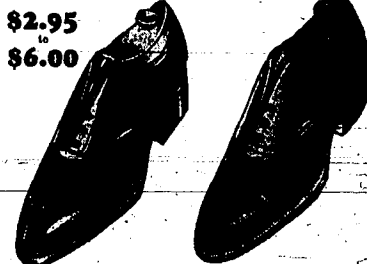

FRENCH REFUSED WAR CONFERENCE, SOVIET REVEALS

LITVINOV STATES RUSSIANS SOUGHT SPECIAL MEETING

GENEVA, Sept. 21 (AP)—Maxim Litvinov, Soviet Russia's foreign minister, told the League of Nations assembly today that Russia had wanted a conference among the war departments of Czechoslovakia, France, and Russia to devise means to protect the Czech republic from Nazi Germany, but that France had refused.

He also revealed that France had refused the Soviet proposal to "afford assistance to Czechoslovakia by the ways open to us."

Speaking for the two nations pledged by treaty to defend Czechoslovakia against aggression, Litvinov attacked British and French policy. France he blamed for the present plight of the Czechs. The British policy of "non-resistance to evil and humoring aggressors" had strengthened "the aggressor bloc" of Germany, Italy and Japan, he said.

Won't Prevent War

He told the delegates of the nations which still remain in the league, that the dismemberment of Czechoslovakia today would not prevent a large scale war tomorrow.

Clubby, eloquent, Litvinov addressed a packed gallery and a tense assembly. He told them that international problems could not be settled by "granting bonuses for sober rattling."

Then proceeding to reveal secret diplomatic conversations of the last few days he said:

"When a few days before I left for Geneva, the French government for the first time inquired as to our attitude in the event of an attack on Czechoslovakia. I gave in the name of my government the following perfectly clear, unambiguous reply:

"We intend to fulfill our obligations under the pact and together with France to afford assistance to us. Our war department is ready immediately to participate in a conference of the representatives of the French and Czechoslovak war departments in order to discuss measures appropriate to the moment."

Gay Germans Await Official Surrender of Sudetenland

CRISIS BELIEVED PASSED; NAZIS MAY BOOST ANTE

By WERN MILLER
(Copyright 1938, United Press)
GODESGER, Germany, Sept. 21 (U.P.)—A gay and happy Godesger awaited Adolf Hitler today, eager to cheer and salute him as he came to receive, from the prime minister of Great Britain, the surrender of the Sudeten area of Czechoslovakia. A propaganda ministry bulletin, announcing that the Czechoslovak government had yielded to a ultimatum of British-French surrender ultimatum, had preceded him.

A thrill of pride and joy swept through the little town as the news circulated. The fuhrer had won. Germans were careful to say that his approval must still be won by Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain and to the discomfiture of the British and Premier Edouard Daladier of France had imposed it on Czechoslovakia.

But there was an atmosphere of gentility in German official circles. The crisis was past, it was said, with the successive surrender of the British, French and Czechoslovak cabinets; details could be ironed out between Chamberlain and Hitler, with Hitler, naturally, holding the iron.

"This makes just a nice social call out of Herr Chamberlain's visit," said one observer. There was a feeling, mixed with this friendly atmosphere, however, that now, if the fuhrer chose, he might be able to force Britain and France to make even more concessions.

It was reported in some quarters that the conference tomorrow would be held on a boat in the Rhine, to insure privacy against the jamming crowds around the fuhrer's hotel, to which this is his 86th visit.

Chamberlain's airplane is to arrive tomorrow at Cologne which was the headquarters of the triumphant British army of occupation after the World War, and Hitler was expected to meet the British leader there.

It seemed certain now that Hitler would be satisfied with the offerings Chamberlain will bring. But the news from Prague that the Czechs had capitulated to the demands of their allies, and of Hitler, came none too soon.

Hitler was getting impatient. German news agencies were reporting the massing of Czechoslovak troops on the frontier. The newspapers were lauding the public temper to fighting degree with stories of Czech atrocities. Hitler had expected Chamberlain today. But the difficulty which the British and French governments encountered in forcing Czechoslovakia to approve their own capitulation caused delay.

Hitler Ready to March
The report abroad was that Hitler was ready to march, that he had set tomorrow midnight as his deadline that his troops after that hour would back an expected move by the Sudeten German free corps.

That report was not confirmed here. It was understood that he was adamant in his demand for unconditional surrender but he would take no action before Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain came to see him tomorrow.

Hitler left his mountain villa at Berchtesgaden, near the Austrian border last night, and enroute at Munich for the all night journey to Godesger, Joachim von Ribbentrop, his foreign minister, and Rudolf Hess, deputy leader of the Nazi party, accompanied him.

The Montana delegation will spend the night Thursday at Missoula and will start early Friday for Twin Falls, according to word today from Robert Hays, El Centro, Calif., association secretary to F. G. Thompson, in charge of convention arrangements.

The northern Idaho delegates will join the Montana motorcade en route, Hays said.

Southern Group
Delegations from southern California and Mexico will travel "ad lib" to Las Vegas, N. M., will stop there Thursday night, and will start for Twin Falls Friday morning. The Imperial Valley and Mexican delegations will travel over the new Chuckawalla pass road, north of Niland, the first motorcade to travel directly from the Mexican border using the Four States highway all the way. The start will be made from Hotel Apache, Las Vegas, at 7 a. m. Friday.

Registration of delegates will be held Friday evening and Saturday morning. Mr. Thompson said today. Delegates from four states will meet at 10 a. m. Saturday; open business sessions start at 1:30 p. m. and the convention banquet is set for 7 p. m. at the Park hotel. Business meetings will be at the Legion hall, and official headquarters and registration at the Hesperian hotel.

OLD AGE CLAIMS AT 50 IN AUGUST

Fifty Idaho old-age insurance claims were certified in August for a total of \$88 to the federal program, Charles H. Cannon, Pocatello, manager of the southeastern Idaho field office of the social security board, told the Evening Times today.

Payments for Idaho in August amounted to \$13,124.7. The total paid out so far is \$12,312.04 in Idaho, Mr. Cannon said. Average payment for August was for \$28.37, in contrast to the national average of \$26.80.

The payments were to wage earners who reached the age of 65 and to the heirs or estates of those who have died.

With procedure now fully developed, according to Mr. Cannon, the time required by the board for handling a claim, after its receipt from the Pocatello field office until it is sent to the treasury for payment, has been reduced from an average of 25 days in December of 1937, to only 10 days.

"Single cash payments are the only benefit now being paid," Cannon said. "Monthly retirement benefits to wage earners will not begin until 1942."

Nationally, the \$20,000,000 benefit payment was approved in the first week of September. For the country as a whole, the claims certified during August were 14,622, making a total of 136,425. National payments authorized in August amounted to \$227,088.48, bringing total payments to \$7,532,261.45.

BOND CAMPAIGN GAINS AT FILER

Encouraged by overwhelming success in the bond issue in Twin Falls its neighboring city, Filer, advocates of the rural high school bond proposal for a modern combined classroom-auditorium-gymnasium building pushed ahead today with renewed vigor.

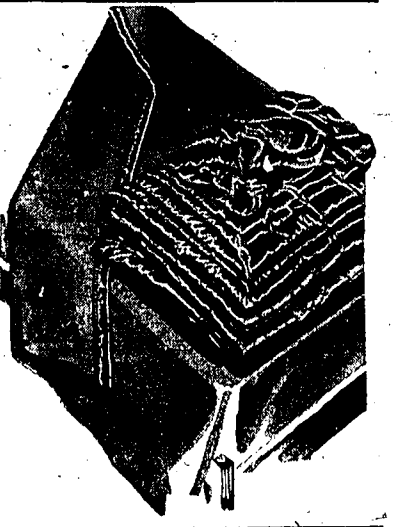
