

The truth is that while we are a race of matchless gadget-makers, technicians and inventors, we don't know much more than the ancient Romans knew about

know much more than the ancient Romans knew about the business of running society intelligently.

And it is that fact that will be interesting to historians of the future. They will want to know how it was that a world so marvelously equipped for living in happiness, peace and plenty managed to travel so fast in the opposite direction.
