WASHINGTON, Oct. 8—New York's election campaign is the big one of the year and it has been presidential year 1940 from several interesting and important angles. Candidates for governor are: District Attorney Thomas E. Dewey, 36-year-old racket buster who accepted the Republican nomination with a promise to bring a new warfare on crime and especially crime linked with politics. Many Republicans regard Dewey as a presidential "wild hope" and the first Gov. Herbert H. Lehman, now ending a third term, immensely popular and a record breaker which has attracted many conservatives as well as liberals and the labor groups.

Disturbed by Dewey. Prospect of Dewey's nomination has apparently been a real political headache in Washington for the past few days. Republicans nominated him unanimously and enthusiastically in the belief he was the only man who would win a political mess which threatened almost certain defeat for the Empire state next November.
