# 'MOOCHER' SAYS HE IS CHAMPION

CLEVELAND, O. (AP) — Arthur Swift, 22, who admits to being the world's champion moocher and "hitch-hiker," believes that, compared with him, Jim Davis, "king of the hoboes," is a rank beginner at the art of getting something for nothing.

"Compared to me," said Swift, who says he has "mooched" more than \$2,000 worth of favors and free rides on planes, boats, and trains, "Davis is a piker." He stays with tramps in jungles while I have slept in the best hotels, eaten in the best restaurants, and met the best people."

Swift claims descent from Jonathan Swift, author of "Gulliver's Travels," and says he has hitchhiked his way into every state in the union at least four times, and to England, France, Canada and Mexico.

He was with Miss Earhart on the 22,000-mile trip, including Henry Ford, Bernard Shaw, 32 governors, Cornelius Vanderbilt, and the late Amelia Earhart, he said.

"I bummed a ride with Miss Earhart in her plane from Newark, N. J., to Indianapolis. Henry Ford gave me \$20, but that Bernard Shaw gave me a job. I told him I wouldn't settle down until I had written material to write books and plays, as he does."

Swift's first attempt to emulate Shaw is called "Everything for Nothing," and deals with his rapid changes of fortune as a knight of the road.

"I told how one night I slept on a park bench, the next night I ate an eight-course dinner and slept at the Waldorf-Astoria, the next night I slept on the Vanderbilt yacht, and the next back on my park bench, among other interesting things," Swift said.

"It's Easy to Explain" — Swift had very little difficulty in explaining his success as a moocher and trawler.

"I have," he explained, "a very attractive personality. I talk well, have a lot of brains, can write, and have been around."

The champion moocher, who started hitch-hiking when he "hunked out" of high school in 1923, is looking for a wife, but girls with an inferiority complex need not apply.

"My marriage," he said, "is going to be a business and money-making proposition. My wife must have money, a technical education and must be able to assist me in my writing."

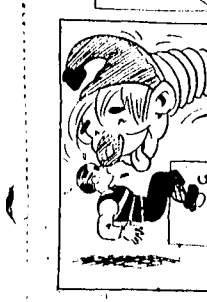

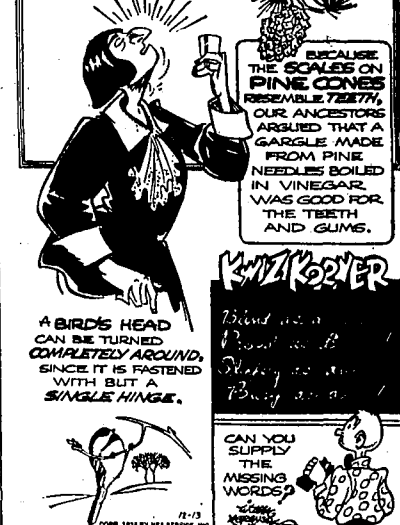
