'Christmas Reprieves' Backfire Again as Youth Faces New Charge

CLAIMS OF AUTO THEFT ADDED TO POSTAL ROBBERY

GLENN PERRY, Jan. 7 (Special)—Second "backfire" by one of Gov. Barzilla Clark's "Christmas parables" from the Idaho state prison has done no light here today by E. L. PILOTS PROTEST AVIATION PLANS

Fliers and other persons from over this section of Idaho who are interested in the future of aviation today were signing petitions protesting the "discrimination" which is being shown in the federal government's proposed plan to train civilian pilots for military service.

The petitions were received here by Leonard Dean, president of the Idaho Pilots' association, from the Riverside pilots' association, Riverside airport, Riverside, Mass.

It is the plan of the Riverside group to present such petitions to the federal government, asking that civilian fliers have the same opportunity of entering upon training furnished by such a civilian air reserve plan as is planned to afford college students.

The subject matter of the petitions follows:

"We, the undersigned civilian fliers and others actively interested in the practical development of aviation and aerial defense of this nation, hereby protest the discrimination in the proposed civilian air reserve plan which limits flight training to college students only.

"We, as representatives of this group, petition for aviation training for all, without the college requirement."

It was said this afternoon that the petitions would be sent back as soon as they are signed.
