



At least that's a fair deduction from the 1938 figures on fatal accidents compiled by the National a Safety council. They show that while 32,000 persons were killed in traffic accidents, 32,500 were killed by

were killed in traffic accidents, 32,500 were killed by accidents in their own homes.

For the first time in 10 years the home was more deadly than traffic, for while concentrated traffic safety drives were cutting the traffic toll by 7,640, a reduction of 19 per cent, fatal home accidents increased two per cent.

The accident prevention work of the National Safety council and other agencies proved them a real national asset in the year just passed. For they helped the United States to cut its accident death toll by 10,200 for the year. Further, 700,000 fewer persons were disabled by injuries in 1938 than in 1937.
