Good Will Trio Of University Addresses Girls

Dean of Women Beatrice Olson, of the University of Idaho, Moscow, spoke yesterday to a meeting of the girls of Twin Falls high school on her impressions of Idaho. Also speaking were the two university girls who accompanied her, Miss Doris Franson and Miss Ardis Simpson. They are on a good will tour of several southern Idaho cities.

The dean was presented to the group by Miss Virginia Ann Chase, president of the Girls' league, who presided. Her introduction was made from the point of the modern girl. New this year to the Idaho campus, Miss Olson told the girls her first impressions of the school and the town, as she stood in the doorway of the administration building and looked over the campus and the hills of Moscow. She presented the other two speakers.

"Vocational Opportunities" was the subject of Miss Franson's talk. She told of the choice of vocations at Idaho, and the work in such departments as the journalism and economics schools. She also touched upon chances for self-help in going to school.

PAR JAILED FOLLOW CONVICTION FOR ESPIONAGE

Mikhail Gorin, Hafis Salich to Seek New Trial

LOS ANGELES, March 11 (UP)—Mikhail Gorin, Russian government agent, and Hafis Salich, former naval intelligence officer, were in jail today convicted of stealing United States defense secrets for Russia.

After conviction by a federal court jury foremaned by a determination by the United States supreme court that the conviction was based on evidence obtained during World War days and indirectly of the value of this country's counter-espionage activities.

Their attorneys said they would appeal for a new trial and, if necessary, would seek the case in the supreme court in an attempt to establish their claim that the stolen information, principally concerning Japan's naval and military plans and her espionage activities, could not be used by Russia to the detriment of U. S. national defense.

Judge Ralph Jenney said he would grant them a hearing on the appeal plea before passing sentence.

Gorin's blond wife, Natasha, was acquitted on a single charge of conspiracy in connection with the espionage scheme. Gorin and Salich were convicted on two counts of espionage and one of conspiracy. The maximum sentence is five years.

Deliberate Two Hours
The government charged Gorin paid \$1,700 to hand over secret reports on the Japanese navy contained in confidential files at the San Pedro intelligence bureau. The verdict was reached after a two-hour and 10-minute deliberation by a jury of middle-aged industrialists and business men, stunned Salich and Gorin.

Gorin's attorney asked that he be permitted to continue at liberty on \$25,000 bail, which he offered. It was said, was put up by the Soviet embassy. U. S. Attorney Benjamin Harrison protested, and demanded the bail be raised to \$50,000.

Judge Jenney withheld decision on the bail and ordered the men locked up. Harrison said he would confer with Attorney General Frank Murphy, in Washington, D. C., for advice on the matter.
