It's Nice to Get Back to Shadow-Boxing

After all the grim and grisly realities that plague the world these days, it is nice to get back to a nice, pleasant little shadow-boxing contest about something that doesn't make any difference.

In fact, it is a good omen to see those old, old questions resurrected — Do Americans speak English? and, What are those Americans doing to the King's

Just because, for a change, it isn't of the slimmest importance, let's take up the complaint of S. F. Markham, a member of the house of commons, that American slang is debauching the topous of Shakamana. can slang is debauching the tongue of Shakespeare and Milton.

Markham views with unmitigated horror the pro-

Markhan views with unmitigated horror the prospect that on some future and parlous day "the first commissioner of works, in his zest for bringing the house up to date, will label the 'Aye' lobby the 'Sez You' lobby, and the other the 'Include Me Out' lobby."

Whoever the first commissioner of works may be, he might do worse. The innovation might serve to stir a little spice into a legislative procedure which, if our own is any criterion, probably lacks something of being at all times breathlessly inspiring.

Markham has already been well answered by Stephen Leacock, the Canadian economist-humorist, who admits that he himself speaks "Ontario English." Leacock makes clear that slang is nothing to worry about, so far as the future of the English language is about, so IAT as the future of the English language is concerned, for time shows that only those slang phrases and words which have actual merit tend to survive. And if they make a genuine addition to the language, as tested by time, they can only make the language better.

Markham shows himself, however, how difficult its going to be to keep some Americanisms from nailing down a permanent place for themselves in the English of the future.

Many, he laments, find it difficult to learn to say "sausage sandwich" instead of "hot dog." Ghosts of Gower! If these are synonymous that

"sausage sandwich" instead of "hot dog." Ghosts of Gower! If these are synonymous, then words have indeed lost their meanings!

Imagine sidling up to a British lunch-wagon and asking for a sausage sandwich. You might receive two slices of bread with a few cold slices of bauern-wurst laid to rest between them.

This culinary sacrilege would make Shakespeare himself yearn for the precision and the associations of the good old American word "hot dog!"

6,000,000 Sick People

Can you imagine the desolation of an epidemic that had 6,000,000 people sick enough on any one day to be kept from their work.

It would be a very terrible one. Surely there has never been any such epidemic, especially in these days of modern medicine.

Probably not. And yet on any winter day, 6,000,000 persons in the United States are unable to pursue their ordinary occupations because of illness or injury. The recent national health survey is authority for this.

for this.

It seems less impressive because many causes and diseases are at fault, and because 2,500,000 of these disabled are suffering from a chronic disease. Yet not less than two and a half billion days of incapacitation.

not less than two and a half billion days of incapacitating illness are suffered every year.

Surely that makes it plain that the field for work on the health of the people is broad enough to suggest that our task is only beginning.

An Industrial Tragedy

There is a sadness, too, about the "death" of in-animate things. A great ship goes to the breakers' yards on her last voyage, and something of the laugh-ter and tears of vanished passengers echoes about her still her still.

Even a factory can produce something of that same sense of tragedy, that same echo of past activities and life.

and life.

It hangs heavy over the once-great Pierce-Arrow factory at Buffalo. Dies, drills, gauges, once valued in millians, are being sold off in a five-and-ten-cent sale in the quiet alsles of the empty factory. Inkpots and pens that once signed checks for hundreds of thousands, are knocked down for a few cents. Filing cabinets go out, that once held correspondence from every country in the world and the details of a business that meant work for 10,000 men and a payroll in 1918 of \$15,000,000.






