



Women on the Jury

Probably it will come as a surprise to most readers to learn that in only 25 states have women the right

Probably it will come as a surprise to most readers to learn that in only 25 states have women the right to sit on juries.

Illinois and Montana have just taken the required action. Of these 25 states, only 13 make jury service compulsory for women as well as for men.

We'll bet a good many people, if asked about this question, would have said, "Why, that was all settled back in 1919 when the constitutional amendment giving women the suffrage was adopted." But not so. Neither the complexities of the American federal-state government relationships, nor the intricacies of the law itself permit such simplicity.

For instance, in Illinois, all that was necessary was to insert "of both sexes" into the existing jury law. You see, the Taw had provided that jurors should be chosen from the voters. That would seem clear enough to the lay mind. The assumption is that since women became voters in 1919, they were thereupon eligible for jury duty. But not so. In 1925, the state supreme court was still holding that the law meant "men voters." As a matter of fact, various states led by Michigan, began giving women the right to serve on juries as early as 1915. Michigan, began giving women the right to serve on juries as early as 1915.

But this survey of the "women-on-juries" situation by the Council of State Governments shows, conversely, that in 23 states women have neither the right nor the duty to serve on juries. This, mark you, is 20 years after the granting of the suffrage. It is a curious quirk of mentality indeed, which concedes women the ability to vote for the presidency, for the largest national issues, for state, county, and local officials, yet not the ability to decide whether the man stole the \$150 or not.

The old arguments are still being advanced: It would cost too much to provide special quarters for women jurors, women lack logical judgment and make their decisions on sentiment, and so on.

Toll Without War

We talk glibly these days about building up great air fleets. We talk in terms of thousands of ships, as though there was nothing to it but to push the button and wait for the ships to come off the production line. duction line.

What this means in human terms, we do not think. But it means that air armament is taking its toll steadily and relentlessly in picked young men. No exact figures are known, but it is believed that Germany kills about three pilots every two days, England and France at least one every three days, Italy perhaps as many, merely incident to flying routine.

Does it seem silly to think of this, when a war has just closed in Spain that took a million dead, and while the thousands are still being mowed down daily in China?

China?

Perhaps. But in a program of air armament expansion, that is one element that must be counted in—the regular toll of pilots who must die in the course of everyday practice flying, even without any war at all.

In the United States such accidents are still rare enough to bring out great headlines whenever they happen. But we too, as we expand our air force, must pay in blood as well as in dollars for the arms race,

Careful, Dr. Benes!

In most of the things he has done since coming to the United States, Dr. Eduard Benes, former president of Czechoslovakia, has been wise and temperate. We have admired his courage and his balance.

But he is "off on the wrong foot" in his latest statement. Certain Slovak organizations have refused to support Benes' organization working for restoration of the Czech republic. They argue that their Slovak minority was heartlessly exploited by the ruling Czechs, therefore they will have nothing to do with the Benes organization.

Whether they are right or not, most Americans have no way of knowing. They have no opiniqu. But Benes' reply is of interest-because it follows a line common in political "argument" today. Benes said simply "Those who are against the restoration of Czechoslovakia (as it was in 1937) are followers of Hitter."

It doesn't follow. And it is regrettable to see Dr. Benes descend to that lowest level of political argument today, which consists of crying, "Yah! Dirty Fascist!" or "Yah! 


