Borah Comes Home to Rest

Death comes to all men, great and small, and so it has to Senator William E. Borah, one of the greatest statesmen in American history.

And with his death comes the realization that the

And with his death comes the realization that the nation has lost a valuable influence—a loss the country can ill afford at times like the present.

Only a few days ago, in the last speech he made from the floor of the United States senate, Senator Borah sounded another of his characteristic warnings. It had to do with a proposal for extending individual power in government. "Clearly unconstitutional," he boomed in firm denunciation. "A violation of the most fundamental principles of constitutional government and democratic processes."

During his more than 30 years in the United States senate, Senator Borah had sounded many such warnings. He always deplored any uncontrolled power that might have a tendency to undermine the American democracy. A staunch isolationist, he always advocated a policy of minding our own business insofar as possible in international affairs. Largely through his efforts, the United States escaped being drawn into the League of Nations and the World Court.

Although he was usually mostigated by a superse and

Although he was usually motivated by a sincere ap-preciation of the underlying principles upon which our government was founded, Senator Borah often encountered opposition from those not so respectful of these principles. Although always a Republican, neither would he adhere strictly to the well defined partisan lines, particularly if they did not appear in keeping with his ideals. Because of his convictions, Senator Borah was often branded as an obstructionist—but these convic-

often branded as an obstructionist—but these convictions surmounted all opposition to the last. And strangely enough many of those who had taken exception to his wiews in the past, saw in him in recent years the very influence that is necessary in these changing times. That's why his death comes as a serious loss to the nation.

From all walks of life in the United States come sincere expressions of vegret over his passing—excent

From all walks of life in the United States come sincere expressions of regret over his passing—expressions based upon profound admiration for the service he has given the country, and perhaps some apprehension over the loss of his much-needed counter balancing influence.

Idaho should feel greatly honored that Senator Borah, while gaining world-wide recognition during his third of a century in the United States senate, was doing so as a representative of this state "back in the mountains" where he'll now come home to rest.


