Highest-Paid American "Unknown" in Home City

(By NEA Service) BOSTON.—Though Francis A. Countway, 75, is the highest-paid executive employee in the United States, the average man on the street in the city where he was born, raised and worked his way never heard of him.

The news that his \$469,718 salary—aid—bonus compensation for 1939 was high when framed as an American wage-earner, leaving even Hollywood's salary royalty list, was also about the first time his name had been heard.

Countway's obscurity is no accident. While the company of which he is head, Lever Brothers, an industrial neighbor of Harvard University in Cambridge, has spent millions of dollars annually advertising its soap products, Mr. Countway has avoided anything that might draw attention to himself.

He declined to grant an interview in connection with his becoming champion pay-check drawer. "This thing is merely a temporary interest," he said staidly. "It will all be forgotten tomorrow."

Countway, who outranked the \$53,440 salary of Thomas J. Watson, head of International Business Machines, and the \$30,944 salary of A. C. Pillsbury, president of the Pillsbury Refining Corporation of New York.

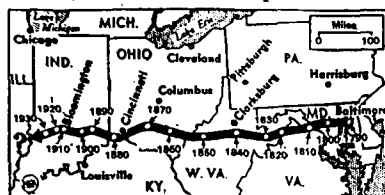

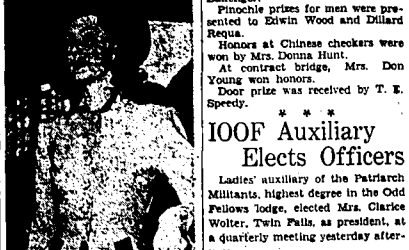

In 1901, when the A. B. C. was first organized, Detroit started with two marks to its credit, including the period of duration.

With this mark practically certain to be broken, Detroit starts a new era of bowling.

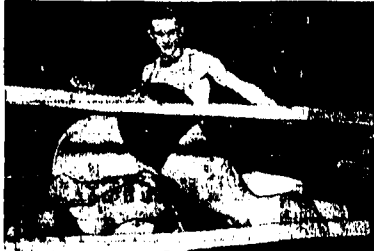
