The Scavenger Gang Grows Away down at the bottom of American society-
so far down that nost people scarcely know about itis a growing army of dirty, bedraggled, shiftless, in different misfits, who are causing local officials considerable concern.
It is the Scavenger Gang-the people who live in makeshift huts and lean-tos or tattered tents along
river banks, in fields on the outskirts of town or, more often, on the fringes of city dumps. They are usually spiritiess men and women, offering nothing but bleak promise to their grimy or sppring. They are men who
don't want jobs, but are righteously indignant when relief
Most people don't know about these conditions first hand. It is not pleasant to know about them. They
have seen the shacks, perhaps, from a distance. But they have never been up close. They have never met the residents. They have never been inside to see the dirt floors, the broken improvised furniture, the
filthy clothes. Those who have ventured a closer inspection have usually been thoroughly nauseated.
If the Scavenger Gang could be left alone, to diminway to handle the situation. But its numbers don't diminish. They've been increasing in the past 10 years. Their families are large, and new members are being
born into them. While the problem once was of such slight importance that it could be overlooked by city officials and sociologists, it is no longer trivial.
To themselves, the members of Scavenger Gangs
are utterly worthless; to society, they are rapidly becoming dangerous. The older members of the gangs are too indolent to attempt crime of any kind except possibly petty pilfering from refuse dumps. But their children have not yet had all their spirit knocked out of them.
The youngsters are not content to sit forever in grime. They want action and excitement, and the only
way to get it that they know of is to turn to crime Way to get it that they know of is to turn to crime. As a result, juvenile agencies in many communities right into their laps-and they know there isn't much they can do about it.
What can anyone do about these people? How are
you going to find jobs for them if they don't want you going to find jobs for them if they don't want
jobs? How are you going to do anything to help them if they are unwilling to help themselves?
They can't stay-and yet, they can't go. There's no
place for them to go, except possibly to new Scavenger camps in other cities. Arbitrarily driving them out ien't going to help matters. Juggling them around wont decroase their numbers
