

#### Lobbies Are Legitimate

There's a definite place for lobbyists in government, but perhaps they ought to change their title. The term "lobbying" needn't mean any activity with a slightly unpleasant odor about it. It may even cover a perfectly legitimate activity, important to a government that keeps getting more complex; important to its people who might otherwise find themselves drawn farther and farther away from the men they have elected to office.

Industry and all the other phases of American life have become so involved that no one man, nor small group of persons, could be equipped to furnish the kind of information congress requires each session to reach

of information congress requires each session to reach an understanding of its problems. That's where lobbies come in. Whole industries get together, maintain staffs for research work, co-ordinate their efforts and are in a position to lay before the government or any of its departments the kind of information it wants.

There is not always any wine-woman-and-song at-mosphere about these activities. They are often carried on openly and legitimately. Lobbying groups do not pretend that they are not interested in their own industries, but there's nothing abnormal about

For instance, in consideration of a new highway For instance, in consideration of a new ingriva-bill, congressional committees may desire consider-able information concerning road contractors. With-fout the benefit of lobbying associations, it might be necessary to poll each contractor individually to ob-tain a fair picture, or to do without the statistics

In a way, it is through the lobbies that congress is partly able to feel the pulse of public opinion on scertain-issues. Because, with exceptions, lobbies do make an effort to represent their groups fairly, and their activities in. Washington or in state capitals most often reflect the general attitude of the people. Pyke Johnson, executive vice president of the Automobile Manufacturers' association, said recently: "Fo believe that...individual interests, themselves but a small segment of society as a whole, can hold legislative control through the operations of an individual who does not reflect the public opinion of the moment, is to return to the days and beliefs of good old King Canute, and with about the same effectiveness."

Lobbying need not necessarily be a sin. Operated legitimately, lobbies can be important and beneficent forces in American life.


