

The World Has Caught up With Us

Isolation is a part of the American dream. A great part of the people who came to this country from abroad from 1607 to 1941-a long time, mark you—came to get away from something. They came to get away from religious persecution, from useless war, from economic distress. For a long time America was a haven.

haven.

Today America is a part of the world. It does not matter that we do not wish it so. It does not matter that there is a little particle of tradition down in the bottom of every one of us which cries protestingly, "No, no." It is true. Science, that obliterator of time and space, has brought the world into a unity. There is no place that is today "out of the world"—not Tahiti, not the mountains of Ecuador.

One may regret this, but it is true. Nothing could be more hopeless than to base action on what used to be true, or on what we wish were true. Greenland was once remote, an unreal plaything of explorers. Today it is a stepping-stone for bombers, a danger, and the United States had better "be there first," no matter what the cost. For whatever that cost might be, it is less than the cost of yielding, without a struggle, the outer rampart.

A prominent Broadway leader of the show world has a motto, and it isn't a bad one for nations, too. It is, "Don't kid yourself," That is what we are doing when we try to reassure ourselves that the United States can go on, unmolested, to achieve a destiny separate and unique in an interlaced world. It can't be

arate and unique in an interlaced world. It can't be done any more, if it ever could.

The change is a change of this century. It is during the past 30 years that transport has speeded up; until then, men traveled at scarcely greater speed than the Romans. The world in which the United States was able to win the revolution (with the invaluable help of a French fleet) continued down to World war days. It was not until after that war that U. S. Navy NC-boats made the first Atlantic crossing by airplane. The world grew smaller then, the world changed, more than it had changed in a similar period since Salamis.

There is no salvation for the United States in mental retreat to a dream of childhood, any more than there is for an individual.

We are grown up now, and the world, from which we might have liked to withdraw, is on our doorstep. We must play our part in that world, and play it like free men and women.

Time, and the shrinking of the world by science, have left us no choice.

The Americas Act Together

Every time the American nations act together on a matter there is a net gain for the principle of a united western hemisphere. Their joint action in recommending a common policy toward foreign-flag ships lying idle in their ports is excellent.

It is a reasonable, sensible attitude, too. The American services and the sensible attitude, too.

It is a reasonable, sensible attitude, too. The American nations do not normally have between them enough ships to carry their trade. In normal times this trade is largely carried in foreign, European, ships. Those ships are either at the bottom of the ocean today or blockaded. So it is only sensible to use for inter-American trade those ships which lie rusting at anchor in American ports. That should release for war service any ships the British may be using in that trade.

Without going into long dissertations on international law, it is a sensible thing to do, if, as is only right, the ships are paid for when peace comes again.

What Goes'to Greenland?

What steps the government has taken to make good its guarantee to Greenland have not been revealed. To

its guarantee to Greenland have not been revealed. To reveal now exactly what they are might be unwise from the military point of view.

It is to be hoped, however, that they are adequate steps. Nothing is worse than bluffing. We have said that we would not permit Greenland to pass into the hands of another European power than Denmark. We must make good. It must be made clear that when we drawe a line, we have to t. Whatever force is sent to Greenland must be neither too little nor too late. The folly of such sectures has been all too clearly shown.




