In fill as a showdown approaches on what activate this state will take on the government's proposal to establish the Columbia river authority. They must realize that this proposal amounts to nothing less than complete federal control, not only of the Columbia, but of all its tributaries as well, including our own Snake river. It would extend even further than that, for all tributaries of the Snake would come under federal jurisdiction with all its ramifications. At its executive session in Twin Falls tomorrow, the Idaho State Reclamation association will reach a decision on this very issue, determining the attitude the Idaho delegation will take when it goes to the National Reclamation association's conference in Phoenix, Ariz, Oct. 15-17. Therefore, whatever the decision may be, it will have a vital bearing on the future of reclamation in Idaho. Secretary of Interior Harold L. Ickes, under whose control the Columbia river watershed would fall should such an "authority" be established, would like to make it appear that such a plan is our only salva-tion.
