### What About Our Hospital?

What ADOUL OUF HOSPITAL.

Now that new regulations have been adopted to operate the county hospital within its limitations, an even more serious situation, exists in this vicinity because of inadequate hospital facilities—a condition demanding an early solution.

So the people of Twin Falls county will not regard this action as coming in the nature of a reprisal be-

this action as coming in the nature of a reprisal be-cause of the recent defeat of a \$250,000 bond issue for hospital improvements, it should be explained that these restrictions are being enforced on advice of the county attorney. His warning leaves no other recourse for the county commissioners or the hospital

board.

Perhaps the voters, in defeating the bond issue, didnot fully realize the seriousness of the conditions at
the hospital, or they may have had other good reasons
for their disapproval. But all that is past and any
further discussion of the bond election will avail us

nothing.

The fact remains, however, that this vicinity is dan-

The fact remains, however, that this vicinity is dangerously lacking in proper hospital accommodations even during normal times, to say nothing about an epidemic or any other serious emergency.

As County Attorney Sweeley explained, we have operated our hospital very much like we might go about filling a rubber bag—always believing the bag, irrespective of its size, would stretch sufficiently to permit of additional room. But, as he further explained, a hospital cannot be operated in such a manner because once it is filled to capacity, it has reached the maximum of its ability to provide its patients with proper care. Crowding them into hallways and squeezing them into wards can only result in confusion that handicaps recovery of every patient in the institution. In addition, such a condition actually invites trouble that might result in serious damage suits, the costs

handicaps recovery of every patient in the institution. In addition, such a condition actually invites trouble that might result in serious damage suits, the costs of which the taxpayers would have to pay.

Now that no patients are permitted in the corridors and the number of beds in the wards must be reduced to guard against these dangers, the hospital actually can accommodate fewer patients than it has in the past by over-crowding, and the problem thereby becomes just that much more acute. When the bed capacity is filled, it will be impossible to admit any additional patients, and this undoubtedly will work hardships in many instances. That's the situation that should bring us to definite realization that something must be done.

Frankly, the county commissioners and hospital board members are at a loss to know what to do. They are conscientious in their request that all civic organizationa in the county end their aid in trying to work out some solution, whether it be a private hospital, an enlarged county institution, or something else.

For our own protection against the time when we might be seriously in need of hospital care, we cannot afford to overlook this responsibility. We are now aware of the conditions and we know what to expect. It's something all of us should be giving serious consideration.
