His fondness for horses extends as such fondness usually does, to dogs. Several small terriers are special pets of his, and his regret has been evident when, on long journeys, it proved impossible to take them along.

In food, as in drink, the prince has been abstemious for years, eating sparingly of simple foods. Hence the much-admired youthful figure, which he has resolutely kept.

RUPERT, Jan. 30 (Special)—County Auditor Isenberg reports that the tax books for the year 1935 have been closed, audited and returned with everything in a satisfactory condition.

The total tax rolls for the year 1935 are \$270,640 and the amount collected for the first half was \$123,041. The delinquent taxes collected during December amounted to \$23,064.21. This amount was \$10,000 more than was collected in December, 1934, from the delinquent list.

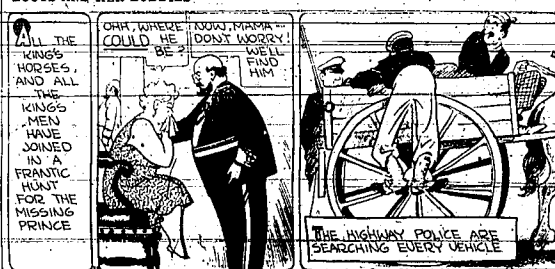

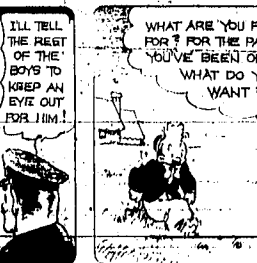
