The verdict, returned at 2:20 p. m., was made shortly after Judge Adam B. Barclay had refused to issue additional instructions on the question of whether Van Vlack, if given the death sentence and then later going in sane, would be given a sanity test before the hanging was carried out.

When the jury filed solemnly into a courtroom tense with expectancy, Judge Barclay asked: "Gentlemen of the jury, have you arrived at a verdict?"-

The verdict was thereupon handed up and recorded by the clerk, who read it aloud.
