DISCOVERY BATTLES FIELD IN RICH HANDICAP RACE

14 FAST HORSES GIVE CHALLENGE

Vanderbilt Entry Seeks Victory for \$100,000 and Title of Decade's Champion

SANTA ANITA RACE TRACK, ARIZONA, Feb. 22.—(Special)—A throng of persons began crowding into the stands here today to see 14 horses challenge Alvin Oyster Vanderbilts Discovery in a race for one of the world's richest purses.

Discovery, pride of Vanderbilts Saguaro farm, was racing for more than the purse in the \$100,000 race which Santa Anita handicap. The son of Display and Arlaine was laying claim to the title of the greatest thoroughbred in the past decade.

Challengers Return
Challengers who had met and on occasions defeated Discovery were back again to match strides with the five-year-old chestnut colored champion.

Of the horses that had defeated Discovery before when given second purses in weight and class, only Top Row and Mrs. F. A. Carraway's Time Supply were rated the best of the bunch.

The top three horses—Discovery, Top Row and Time Supply—all were on edge and ready for the race of their lives. The track had been drying out for the past two days after more than a week of rain, a condition that suited the leading trio. In the heavy mud Discovery is considered virtually unbeatable over the distance, a mile and a quarter. On a light, fast track Time Supply might have a chance.

Although in a handicap race, Discovery was the favorite at odds of 3-1. CAPONE WOUNDED, RUMORS ASSERT

Reports Claim Racketeer Was Hurt in Assassination Try by Other Convicts

According to the rumors, has been transferred to the Alcatraz hospital to save him from possible further attacks. It was also rumored Alcatraz officials were working to have Attorney General Cummings transfer Capone to McNeil island penitentiary, Puget Sound, as a further precaution.

Warden Johnston also flatly denied this.

A steady flow of rumors from Alcatraz the last few weeks pictured Capone as one of the most hated convicts on "the rock" and reported him marked for death by fellow convicts on several occasions, including the hatred at his failure to participate in the "mutiny" and revenge for his alleged responsibility for the St. Valentine day massacre in Chicago in 1929.

The "mutiny" occurred in mid-January and was in protest against the prison's strict discipline. Some 100 convicts went on a "work strike," saying they would refuse to do any work whatever until discipline was relaxed.

Breakdown of the plot were thrown into special "isolation cells," and the "mutiny" collapsed without bloodshed.

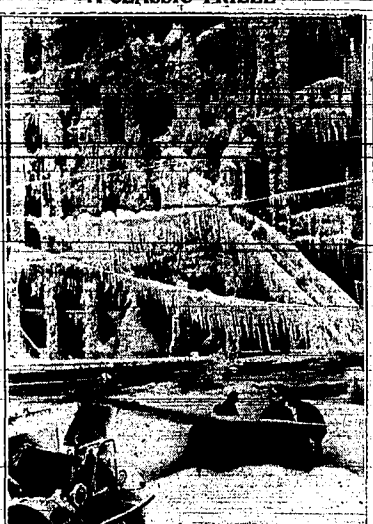
Convicts threatened to lynch Capone for allegedly "agitating" about the "mutiny," and for refusing to participate in it, according to information received by the San Francisco News a few days after the disturbance.

Later reports were that a group of convicts, former friends of "Bugs" Moran, one of Capone's "business" rivals, were plotting to assassinate him to avenge the St. Valentine day massacre in which seven of Moran's gangsters were killed.

U. S. AUTHORIZES APPLE PURCHASE

Davis Orders 70 Added Cars Bought in Idaho Under New Bill

By RALPH W. OLINSTEAD, WASHINGTON (Special).—Sometime ago we wrote that Chester Davis was co-operating with Senator Pope to secure additional legislation for the purchase of surplus crops for the federal surplus relief corporation.

The legislation in question was included in the same deficiency appropriation bill and has now become a law. Consequently the department of agriculture has authorized the purchase of 70 additional cars of apples in the state of Idaho within the next two weeks. This will bring total purchases to 300 cars, 120 of which will be moved out of Idaho in a period of about three weeks. "We have been given assurance that if future help is necessary to maintain the Idaho market after these purchases have been made, further assistance will be forthcoming."

Sen. George Norris, liberal Republican from Nebraska, has recently introduced into the senate a bill to provide for a comprehensive program of rural electrification throughout the United States. A rural electrification program already exists, but does not provide farmers with power with which to obtain the stuff Benjamin Franklin flow his kite for.

Norris' bill would appropriate \$100,000,000 annually for 10 years out of which loans would be made to states in accordance with the proportion between the total number of farms in the state and the number of farms not receiving central station electric light and power service. Loans would be for a period of not to exceed 40 years and bear 3 per cent interest. Municipalities, irrigation companies, non-profit irrigation companies, and other political subdivisions would be eligible to borrow in Idaho.

The bill has been reported by the senate agriculture and forestry committee and is now pending before the senate.
