CLASSIFICATION

After all the political bickerings of the past several months, issues, personalities, candidacies, will soon commence to clarify. Rival camps will be united, critics will get around the presidential band wagon and matters which at one time loomed important will vanish like the mist in the noon-day sun.

We now have the spectacle of Borah, Knox, Landon, Vandenberg, and Hoover even, rivals for the Republican presidential nomination, with adherents of each staunchly believing that only their man has the requisite qualities for success, despite the diversity, say, between Borah and Hoover. Yet the nominee at Cleveland will be expected to attract all the rival members of that party—impossible as such a task will be.

And in the Democratic camp the antagonisms of Roosevelt, even those who have threatened to "take a walk," would do so reluctantly, for party loyalty runs quite as strong in the blood as patriotism.

This thing holds true regarding politics: people like to be with the winner. Men will stifle their personal differences to achieve party success. That is what party politics is.

But sitting back, determining the fate of the parties is that great mass of independent voters who make the decision.

It is to this controlling factor that political parties must make their appeal and there is no discounting the strength of this vote. Respect for it grows with the years.

This campaign that the political maneuverings will be particularly interesting for great skill will be brought to play, despite the fact that at this date the reelection of President Roosevelt appears inevitable.

Classification of issues will increase as the convention primary and election dates draw nearer. Sifted and shown of much of the chaff which now clutters the political landscape, the issues of 1936 will not be nearly so complicated in November as they are in May.

Well conducted campaigns on the part of both parties in reality should be educational drives to this end.

BARAINS MAY SAVE RAILROADS

Some time during the next few weeks we shall probably find out whether the great eastern railroads are going to go to court to keep the Interstate Commerce Commission from increasing their passenger business for them.

The commission has ruled that railroad passenger fares must come down from 8.6 cents a mile to 2 cents. The rail road presidents are protesting in that order, the mischievous vapor of the bankruptcy courts. Before very long they must make up their minds whether they are going to call in the lawyers or let nature take her course.

If the railroad men don't like the order, however, it would be foolish for them to blame the I. C. C. The real villain of the piece is up and not the average American citizen, with his unquenchable fondness for bargains.

This American citizen used to travel by railroad whenever he went anywhere, for the very good reason that there was no other way of getting there. In the fulness of time, however, automobiles and buses were placed at his disposal, and then he made an interesting discovery.

He found that if he used one of the other of these conveyances he could get where he was going for less money than he would have to pay the railroads to carry him. And in that moment the troubles of the railroads began.

Passenger trains that used to run regularly in two and three sections started running in one. Local trains died pitifully among the rolling hills and grass-grown plains of the rural districts. Pullman porters grew weary from looking at cars in which they had only three or four customers. And the railroads' income from passenger trains dropped and dropped as if the bottom of all things had been removed.

A few years ago certain western and southern railroads began to meditate on the American's fondness for bargains, and decided that if cheap travel was what the citizen wanted, cheap travel was what he would have. So they cut prices and waited to see what would happen.

What happened was enlightening. Travel by train began to increase again. With it, in spite of the lower rates, passenger train income. The supposedly moribund passenger business began to sit up and ask for solid foods. After that, extension of the new rate scale to the entire country was more or less inevitable. The I. C. C.'s recent order was to be expected; and it will be very hard to convince the ordinary citizen that it was not a win and just order.
