## PLANNING BOARDS CONVENE MAY 21

County Units Will Meet With State Commission, Wood Announces

District meeting of the state planning commission will be held at the Chamber of Commerce rooms here Thursday, May 21, according to announcement of J. D. Wood, consultant.

Members of planning boards in Blaine, Camas, Lincoln, Gooding, Minidoka, Jerome, Cassia and Twin Falls counties will be invited, as well as officials of canal and irrigation companies, school districts and municipalities.

Advice will be given by the state planning board on any questions concerning the plans to utilize agricultural products in industries, for recreational, scenic, and forest resources of this area will be discussed.

A report of the school survey being conducted by W. W. Davis, assistant state superintendent of public instruction, will be given; and other problems pertaining to the planning contemplated by district, county, or other political subdivisions of this area will be brought up for discussion, states Wood.

## NEW ZEP BRINGS AIR ROUTE NEAR

North Atlantic Crossing Will Mean Regular Service—Is Step Closer

BERLIN, (U.P.)—Regular North Atlantic air service, envisioned as a regular German-American co-operative service, if plans can be realized and the menace of North Atlantic gales overcome.

Airplanes may have a speed advantage. They may be in service on the same route long before a regular zeppelin service can be established. But according to Dr. Hugo Eckener, who knows more about regular ocean flights than any man alive, airplanes may never be practical the year round in the North Atlantic.

See Planes At Disadvantage

Even if they are, Zeppelin experts believe they can offer advantages in competition—roominess, comfort, carrying capacity and safety which the planes cannot hope to match. They point to the dimensions and specifications of the new ship as proof.

The Hindenburg is 813 feet long, only slightly shorter than the liner Queen Mary, which it will follow closely on a maiden trip to New York. It is capable, with the 7,500,000 cubic feet of gas space—twice that of the Graf Zeppelin—of carrying 50 passengers, a crew of 40, and 20 tons of freight at a cruising speed of 50 miles an hour. The Hindenburg's cruising radius is 10,000 miles.

Four motors.

Four specially constructed Daimler-Benz motors, each developing 900 horsepower and turning a propeller 19 feet from tip to tip, drive the ship. The difficulty of developing these motors was one of the prime factors in the nearly year-long delay in the Hindenburg's flight. Originally it was scheduled for July, 1935.

It is estimated the ship will require two and a half days for the flight to Lakehurst, N. J., from either Frankfurt or Friedrichshafen, and two days for the return flight, traveling westerly winds cause the difference.

had ordered a "hot pass" in operations "due to tactical reasons." It was admitted that the Ethiopian plans had resisted fiercely. They were well armed, well drilled and well commanded, the dispatches said, and outnumbered the Italians. The Italian casualties since April 14, when the attack on the Sanaa Ranch area started, were announced as 21 white officers killed and 36 wounded; 25 white Italian soldiers killed and 47 wounded; 2,367 native troops of Somali, Galla and Lillo killed or wounded.

Thirteen airplanes have been hit by Ethiopian fire; it was said, and three officers and two non-commissioned officers of their crews were wounded. All the planes returned to their bases, it was asserted.

## GUARDS PREVENT ICE POOL "FIX"

NENANA, Alaska, April 29 (AP)—Summit today patrolled the banks of the Tanana river to prevent possible "fixing" of the ice break, which will determine winner of a \$70,000 pool.

First cracking of the ice was expected at any moment. Soon after the first crack, the mass will begin moving toward the Yukon river. Movement of only an inch is necessary to determine the winner of the pool and, incidentally, herald the advent of spring in the Yukon country.

Scientific System

A scientific timing system will determine the exact time the ice begins to move. Steel rods were driven in the ice and taut wires stretched to a time clock on shore. The slightest movement of the stakes will stop the clock. The pool, a non-profit undertaking, goes to the person most closely guessing the time when the break-up starts. Entrants at \$1 each, admitted guesses from all parts of Alaska, Canada and the United States.

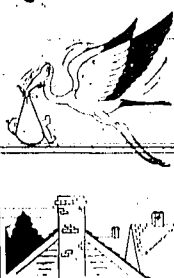
Out-liners in Alaska knew several days ago the break-up was coming. At the time, ice cracked in the tributary China river at Fairbanks. This is normally followed within a few days by the break-up of the Tanana ice.
