Her testimony led to the arrest of Sol Marcus, Trenton, N. J., bookmaker, in connection with the case.

Washington, May 11 (AP)—The vote on Tuesday to amend the Ohio primary law is expected to pass, but it is limited to Democrats and will have no national significance.

Ohio offers another opportunity to measure the Democratic bolt from the New Deal. Col. Henry C. Breckinridge has entered the Democratic primary there against President Roosevelt.

Political observers believe the Ohio, West Virginia and New Jersey contests will be the deciding factors in the election. It is Borah against the field in Ohio with the state Republican organization against him.

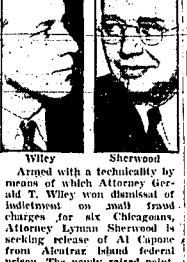

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WATER OUTLOOK TERMED BRIGHT

Experts Forecast Fine Summer
Irrigation Prospect as
Dam Fills

BURLEY, May 11 (Special)—Experts forecast excellent summer irrigation prospects today in record depths of American falls dam, filled to its 1,700,000 acre feet capacity for the third time since its construction in 1926.

It was the first time capacity levels had been recorded since 1929 in the huge reservoir which supplies irrigation water to nearly half a million acres of farm lands along the Snake river.

While increased spring runoff were bringing the lake to record levels, Dana Temple, acting manager, said approximately 40,000 acre feet a day has poured over dam spillways. Most of the water, in fact, has been diverted to supply capacity irrigation needs, but approximately 2,000 second feet has been diverted over Milling dam, thereby being lost to irrigators, but restoring temporarily the beauty of Shoshone falls.

Jackson lake, meantime, was not expected to reach capacity depth until July because of cold weather. The American falls situation, led to predictions that irrigation flows will be maintained at virtual capacity until late in July.

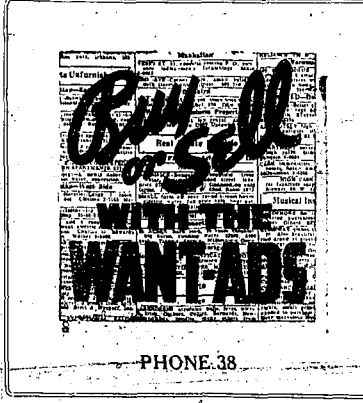




