Convention Formally Opens and Adjourns Swiftly to Hear Stielwer Tonight

sent to the resolutions committee. Brief applause burst out at the announcement.

Brief Opening Schedule

The schedule for the first meeting was brief.

First came the singing of "America," and a prayer, inviolated for the convention by the Rev. Albert Joseph McCarthy of the Covenant First Presbyterian church, Washington, D. C.

Harold H. Burton, who declared the Republican convention in behalf of the city of Cleveland, George D. Brown, secretary of the national committee read the call for the convention.

Stielwer Officially Named

Temporary roll call, election of temporary officers, the formally by which Senator Frederick Stielwer of Oregon officially was named keynote for tonight's session, and selection of committees on credentials, permanent organization, rules and orders of business and resolutions, completed the schedule.

Tonight at 8 o'clock, Stielwer, M. S. T. Stielwer will present his keynote address and the business of the convention will be in full cry.

Silver-haired and smiling, Fletcher was the central figure of today's spectacle. Upon him had fallen the burden of carrying the party machinery in the New Deal years since 1932 and his was the responsibility of organizing today's convention.

Task Nearly Ended

Today when he stepped out to the tip of the runway and brought the convention into formal assembly, his task virtually was concluded.

After selection of the presidential nominee, a new party chairman will be named to lead the Republican campaign.

The Reverend McCarthy, in his opening invocation, noted the great crisis with which the party is confronted.

Mayor Durston presented Cleveland's own platform suggestions in the address which followed.

"This place," he said of public hall, "is dedicated to the conservation of the rights and responsibilities of free assembly and free speech."

Defining Stielwer clearly as "May God help you to define the issues clearly."

The platform was crowded with Republican notables. Senator Arthur Vandenberg of Michigan, dark horse possibility, took a seat for the year after exchanging greetings with Fletcher.

Senator William E. Borah did not appear in the convention hall. From his hotel room he said he probably would not come to the hall, except possibly on platform matters.

Scores of Republican leaders, however, pulled around, exchanging greetings and tidbits of convention gossip. Among early arrivals were John D. M. Hamilton, London manager, former representative Fred H. Britton of Illinois, a Knox man, former Senator William H. Humphrey, former Senator David Reed of Pennsylvania, Representative Joseph Martin of Massachusetts, London floor manager, former Senator George Moses, Knox manager, and Ernest Lee Jahncke, former assistant secretary of the navy, former secretary of the Treasury Ogden L. Mills, former Governor Henry J. Allen of Kansas.

Rumble of Prayer

A great rumble of accompaniment came from the delegates as the Rev. McCarthy invited them to join him in repeating the Lord's prayer.

A covered wagon drawn by four steers, rolled up outside the hall. It carried this sign: "Greetings with the prairie states."

What business after the prayer was the taking of the official photograph of the convention.

Senator Arthur Capper took his seat with the Kansas delegation. "There is no way they can stop London," he said. "If it's not on the first ballot it will be on the second."

Hamilton Watches

Hamilton, wearing a gold and glinting badge as big as the abdomen of a grand marshal in a steeved parade, had an aide sent in the Kansas delegation from which he could closely observe Fletcher whose job as chairman of the Republican national committee he expects to take next Friday if London is nominated.

The picture taking ended at 12:01 p. m. 10 minutes after the convention was supposed to meet. Mayor Harold Burton of Cleveland, courtesied the welcoming speech at 12:00.

Thousands Outside Hall

A thousand persons gathered around the outside of the hall where loud speakers had been set up. A good many were men, some of them and many of the delegates were laughing at the delicate and spectators who had to sit in the muddy, sunny hall.

Fletcher introduced George D. Brown, secretary of the Republican national committee, who delivered to Fletcher the temporary roll call of the convention to be referred to the committee on credentials when it is appointed later today. Fletcher read the official roll for the convention.

LONDON IN CONTACT
FOREIGN — Gov. Alf L. London maintained close contact with his friends and backers in Cleveland who were waiting a battle for his looked-for nomination as the Republican presidential candidate.

At the same time, he went about the duties incident to his office, but planned to be near a radio when the Republican convention proceedings were broadcast.

Last night London addressed the graduating class of the University of Kansas at Lawrence, voicing an answer to the forces at Cleveland which charge he is in with big money and monopoly interests.

His Financial Tendency
London is a close financial adviser in throwing off "shackles of bureaucracy" in connection with an assertion "the people must overthrow the tyranny of monopoly and economic dictatorship."

"Only by overthrowing the one and restoring the other shall we be able to open again and keep open the gate of equal opportunity," London told the graduating students.

London returned here immediately following the address. He will remain here during the conference, and regardless of its outcome, will go on a vacation with his family in Colorado soon.

KNOX ARRIVES
CLEVELAND — Frank Knox arrived today. Members of the campaign didn't know whether he would remain in seclusion or stay around his hotel headquarters as he is "able to the make eye."

If nominated, he was believed to be planning to appear before the convention immediately to make his acceptance speech.
