JAPANESE TRADE DROP ABNORMAL

Expert Assers 'Setbacks' Were Temporary and Were Caused By Martial Factors

TOKYO (AP)—Setbacks in Japan's foreign trade in March, April and May were due in part to the Feb. 29 rebellion of young army officers and to repeated clashes on the Soviet-Manchukuo border, in the opinion of Kamekichi Takahashi, well known economist.

While the Hirota government, and more especially the ministry of finance under Dr. Eiji Baba, have tried to reform the tax program and overhaul the financial setup generally, many circles have indulged in pessimistic speculation regarding foreign trade.

While declines have been recorded, Takahashi believes the causes are temporary.

Abnormal Factors
"Japan's foreign trade suffered some declines from March to early May, it is true," he said, "but we have hastily concluded that the sudden turn for the worse means the general aggravation of the trade situation? Is there not the necessity for us to question whether any abnormal factors influenced the situation? If we look at the trade situation in this way, we reach the conclusion that the trade situation is not abnormal."

"As every one knows, the Feb. 26 incident and the Soviet-Japanese border trouble have had a serious effect on the trade situation. And there is no reason why this situation should not have affected the country's foreign trade."

"Among the consequences the following can be considered:
"The abnormal flight of capital to foreign countries.
"Speculative imports stimulated by the anxiety for government control of imports."

Mentions AKA Ruling
"Of course, it is not clear to what extent these circumstances have affected trade, but I am sure they are partly responsible for the trade upsets. These causes are bound sooner or later to cause a reaction and influence the situation for the better."

"About the time judgment has been given in the AKA cases, the United States pursued an isolationist cotton policy and Japanese cotton imports resumed their purchases for a time. As a reaction resulted, more cotton than usual has been imported into Japan from the United States."

"What, another staple import product, has been heavily imported into Japan for two reasons. One is that there was fear of Japan's levying the trade duties in view of the aggravation of Australian-Japanese trade relations and the Australian woolen market was closed two months earlier than usual. These two factors have resulted in anticipatory and hasty purchases."

AUTOGIROS USED FOR TREE SPRAY

New Method May Be Utilized Widely by U. S. Forest And Park Chiefs

WASHINGTON (AP)—A new method of combating insects in forests and parks throughout the country, if found successful, will be tried out shortly at Mount St. Helens national park, according to A. E. Demaray, acting director of the national park service.

Demaray said the new method, which is purely experimental in its present stage, involves distribution of poison sprays from an autogiro. He said that although dusts and sprays had been successfully dropped from the air over cranberry bogs and cotton fields, there had never been any attempt made to control the insect-infestation of forests by autogiro.

Heavy Losses
For several years, trees and forests of the northeastern states have suffered heavy attacks by canker worms. Demaray said, and the usual method of "dusting" the trees from trucks driven as close as the affected trees as conditions permitted had proven unsuccessful in extensive forest areas.

AMAZING FUTURE IN TANK 'FARMS'

Experiments Get Nearly Magic Results from Chemically Fed Crops

BERKELEY, Cal. (AP)—Experiments in growing crops in tanks, instead of in the soil, are being conducted by the University of California, Berkeley, which state that it may be possible in years to come to grow crops on a large scale in the most arid and practically heated tanks.

A nation without soil is possible, it is believed, according to the university's agricultural experts. Experiments to date have shown that tomatoes, potatoes, beets, cabbages and many other vegetables can thrive in electrically heated tanks.

The crops produced were planted in tanks of water kept at 70° F. by electric waves. Plant food was furnished by chemicals put in the water. The crops thrived almost magically.

SCIENTISTS PLAN ECLIPSE STUDY

Plans Rushed for Soviet and Foreign Savants Intending To Soar Phenomena

MOSCOW, (AP) — Preparations are being completed in Soviet Russia for the observation of the total eclipse of the sun which will be seen June 19 in a zone extending from the Caucasus across the Southern Urals and Siberia to the Pacific Ocean.

Foundations for expeditions and other complex up-to-date installations have been erected in Russian observation points in this zone days before the eclipse. 25 Soviet and 17 foreign astronomical and geophysical expeditions will arrive in the zone. Some have made long journeys by train and others by airplane. Instruments and complete preparations for photographing all phases of the eclipse and studying the spectrum of the solar corona, the microstructure of the chromosphere of the sun and its coronal plasma are being made.

Plans for Harvard Party

The chief astronomical observation at Twin Falls is being made by the Harvard party. The Harvard party is being led by Prof. A. A. Michelson, who is accompanied by a number of other scientists. Eight geophysical observatories and institutes of the Soviet are sending expeditions to the zone of the total eclipse to carry out studies in astrometry, dynamics of the atmosphere and its electrical properties. The Siberian Physical and Technical Institute will study the ionosphere by means of radio signals. The Institute of Physics of the Academy of Sciences is sending scientists to the Caucasus to study the expansion of radio-waves in the atmosphere during the eclipse. In the Urals, a party of zoologists will conduct biological observations.

In Krasnoyarsk and near Orenburg, Soviet scientists intend to make high altitude flights in airplanes to study the cosmic humidity of the sky and the optical properties of the atmosphere during the eclipse. The Moscow Planetarium is making preparations to photograph the eclipse from the ground and air.

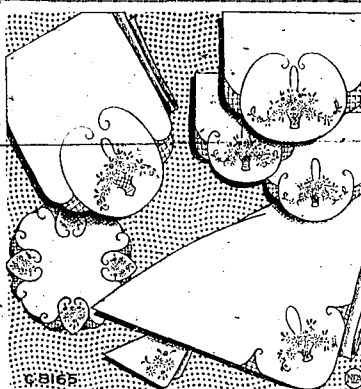



LONDON ACTS TO OPEN CAMPAIGN

Prepares to Start Drive As Nominee; White's Words Linger in Ear

BY LEWIS LARKIN
TUPPER, Kan., June 12 (UPI)—Gov. Alf Landon of Kansas, an avowed presidential nominee of a revitalized Republican party, opened his campaign today for election and an opportunity to balance the federal budget.

Landon was thrilled by the Cleveland stampede. His joy was tempered by the knowledge of responsibility. When the brass band and crowds had gone and the grotesque old executive mansion was left again in quiet as of old, Landon had time to think and to know that from now on he must stand and lead alone.

Solemn Warning
Wise old William Allen White, of Emporia, told him just that in a telephone call early today. From chamber counselor to the younger man went this solemn warning: "From now on, you walk alone. God bless you and keep you brave and kind."

It was all smiles, cheers, and happy tears while the crowd was there, but the words of Emporia's first citizen put the new responsibility in its authentic light. This was a jolting, soul-quickening, heart-swelling day for the governor of Kansas—and his family. They are beginning to realize the magnitude of their job.

Ready to Step Out
Landon has been preparing to step out. He attributes his coming to national politics to his belief in the New Deal for its record of free-spending.

In recent weeks, he has studied the history of "Monopolies and Economic Dictatorship." In his gubernatorial message to a University of Kansas graduating class this week, he outlined his view of the road ahead as the middle ground between monopoly on the one hand and bureaucracy on the other.

Aggressive Campaign
Landon's campaign pledge came shortly before the nomination. "I am elected, I will wage one of the most aggressive campaigns in the history of the Republican party," he said. "I will lead a national party to victory."

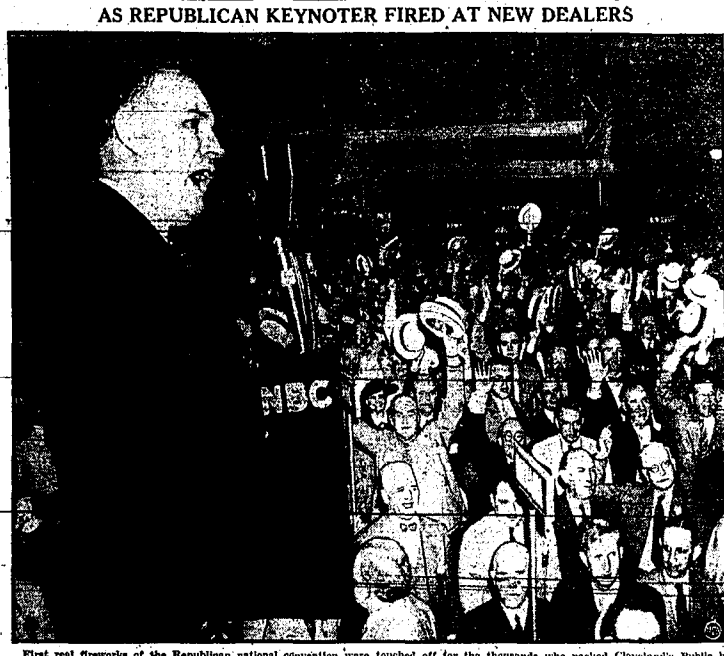
