SPORTSMEN, NOW'S THE TIME TO GET BUSY Perhaps the sportsmen of south central Idaho do not need to be reminded of the fact, but now is the time to wage an effective campaign for a non-partisan state game com-mission.

Many of the candidates who will seek state Many of the candidates who will seek state office already have announced themselves, and within the next few weeks still more will he tossing their hats into the ring. Then will follow the usual barrage of campaign speeches from one end of the state to the other, with platforms, promises and ideas of every description. In Idaho more than 80,000 game licenses are sold annually and that number repre-isents not only a sizeable expenditure on the ipart of the sportsmen, but an important fac-tor in the coming election if the number is tweighed in votes.

tor in the coming election if the number is weighed in votes. Idaho sportamen are well aware of the fact that the state game department is not what it should be, and they are generally familiar with the reason for this condition—politics. Instead of the department being managed by men who have a knowledge of game con-ierration, propagation and the like, these po-sitions in many instances are filled by indi-viduals who have no such qualifications. Ap-pointments of this type very often amount to nothing more than payment of some political debt, and the game department suffers as a consequence.
