

New War Fears Gripe Europe in Czech Crisis

GOVERNOR OF OREGON LOSES PRIMARY RACE Hess Emerges From Comparative Obscurity to Win Democratic Nomination In Bitter Ballot Battle

(By The Associated Press) PORTLAND, Ore., May 21—Henry L. Hess, former state senator, emerged from comparative obscurity today to win the Democratic nomination for governor from his position as former Major General Charles H. Martin. Each hour saw Hess' lead increased.

Unofficial returns from 1694 of the state's precincts have been reported by Senator Morris (Ind-Neb) and both the AFI and CIO, 46,721 votes to 50,905 votes. The former governor who overcame an early lead in primary returns, only to see it melt away.

In a final statement, the governor declared the results had in no way diminished his confidence in the state's future. He said he would be glad to be of service to the people of this state.

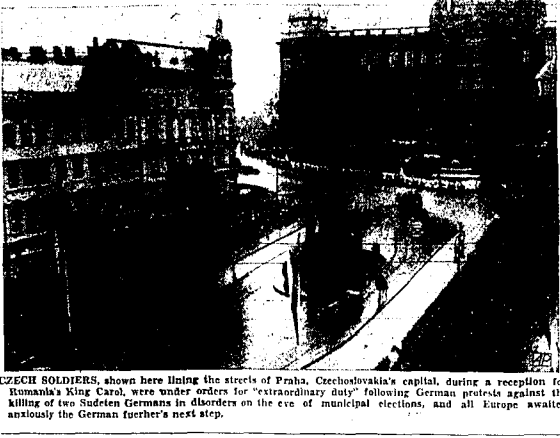

EUROPE ALARMED BY NEW CRISIS Britain Sees Apparent Nazi Disregard for Peace

LONDON, May 22 (Sunday) (AP)—Germany, allied by Poland and France, is demanding a peace treaty from the Czechoslovakia, where two Nazis were killed yesterday.

In a tone as violent as the ultimatum to Austria which preceded German annexation of that country, Field Marshal Hermann Goering, in a "last, urgent appeal" to Czechoslovakia, where two Nazis were killed yesterday.
