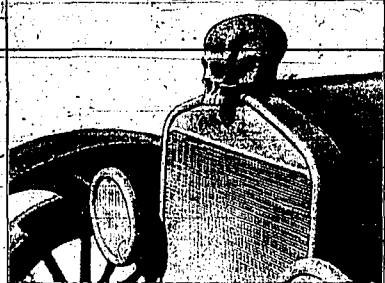

SKULL IS USEFUL AS AUTO DEATH WARNING

STUCK STARTERS CAUSE TROUBLE

Many Drivers Are Prone to Neglect Spark Before Starting.

Stuck starters cause much trouble to motorists, according to a bulletin issued by the mechanical first-aid department of the Chicago Motor club. In many cases this is caused by starting the car with the spark advanced. In the old days, when cars were cranked by hand the motorist remembered the possibility of a broken arm and he was careful to retard the spark before starting. Today, however, the spark is often forgotten and jammed starter gears are legion. To loosen the spring fern the ignition coil engage light gear and rock the car back and forth several times. Knocking the car from side to side will do no good. The backward motion is the one that frees the drive.

Various Causes of Trouble!

Starter tow a car forward, with the starter stuck, as the forward movement jama it tighter. Worn-out brushes may cause considerable drag on the starter. If too low they will cut an electric arc which will burn and pit the commutator, and in some cases even melt the solder in the brush holder. The cause of the ignition coil's head being loose by the mechanical first-aid department were the result of loose wires or battery terminals. Loose ammeter connections are most likely to cause motorist trouble. A single wire leads to the rheostat in the instrument board, and is fastened with a screw terminal. Frequently it works loose. If it comes off entirely there is a break in the electrical system, in which case the car will not start, the horn will not blow, nor will lights burn. If, however, the horn and lights do work the trouble cannot be a broken circuit there and can be traced to the distributor coil, or possibly corroded battery terminals. The battery terminals may be corroded so badly that sufficient current will not pass to operate the starter or the engine, and yet allow enough for the lights and for the horn. The corrosion can be cleaned off with a file and a good connection made.

Trouble With Ammeter

As a rule there is more trouble with the ammeter wire getting loose without coming off than there is in it being broken entirely. When it comes loose it may remain in contact for some distance and a bump in the road may jolt it free. The driver may be ignorant with the car for some time and perhaps the wire will establish contact only to break it later. This process will be repeated until the nut of the terminal is tightened. It sometimes happens that the ammeter reads zero. Loose battery terminals rank next to loose ammeter wires from a trouble standpoint. These the horn or light test will show whether there is a complete break in the circuit, or if the ammeter wire they may be only loose so as to make and break the connection.

Homemade Gaskets Prove to Be Quite Efficient

Some of the paper gaskets used in gear transmission and differential cases, between carburetor passages and in many other places often are of complicated pattern. When they sometimes happen to the amateur repair man, the original gasket breaks a very satisfactory job can always be made with the use of paper. The paper is hammer, a little sulphur and a piece of stout paper. The first operation is to clean up the gasket in the surface upon which the gasket is to go; next cut the paper as nearly as possible to the shape. Fasten in place with shingle and let it dry awhile. Requires only a few minutes. Now, with a hammer, tap along the edges until the gasket breaks through the paper. When you come to rounded corners or to screw ends, make a hole in the paper, then cut the end of the paper, then use paper or stiff paper, a piece of cloth under a transmission or differential cover, etc., will make a gasket that will last.

Poultry Hints

Call out the hen that is persistently broody.

Isn't it funny? Almost everybody's hen seem to lay like this when the rice drops.

The incubator should be located, preferably in a cellar, having good ventilation. If no such location can be had, a room facing the north is the next best place.

Geese dress easier in warm weather than they do in cold, as the feathers do not set so tightly, and in picking them the flesh is not so likely to be torn.

Many of the old, unlit poultry houses now found on farms could be remedied at little expense and trouble in such a way that they would provide a comfortable home for the flock.

Plan to get chicks out on the ground in the sunlight as soon as possible, or for a short while each day.

It will soon be the season for capeworms, and all yards not sown to green feed should be spaded or plowed up. If the worms are thick, scatter lime about the yard before plowing.

Brood fowls for the crop of growing young fowls need strong wooden floors and the opening in front should be closed tight each night to keep down the losses from rain and winds.

When the eggs begin to hatch, the hen should be confined and not disturbed until the hatching is complete.

Hens in the breeding flock should be allowed out of doors in direct sunlight during the winter and encouraged to take plenty of exercise.

The state department of agriculture and leading growers and dealers are to be commended for their action in flying war on those who either through ignorance or vicious motives are seeking to exploit the farmers by interfering with the regulations governing the proper grading of potatoes.

ONE-FOURTH OF L. A. BUTTER IS MADE IN IDAHO

Dairy Husbandman States Idaho Has 40 Creameries and 43 Cheese Factories

One-fourth of the butter consumed in Los Angeles during the first six months of 1926 was supplied by Idaho producers, according to H. J. Fourn, field man of the University of Idaho extension service.

The Los Angeles market has been developing very rapidly. Mr. Fourn said because of population increase and the use of more local milk for table purpose rather than in the form of butter.

In 1925 nearly 17,000,000 pounds of domestic butter was manufactured in the Gem state, more than three times the amount produced in 1920. Idaho, however, produced only about 2 per cent of the butter of the United States and ranks about 18th among the states in butter production.

Most Idaho butter now goes to Pacific coast markets. Mr. Fourn points out, however, that when production in Idaho and other western states increases above cost and local needs, the extra expense of shipping to the east would not in itself be a handicap. The freight rate to New York from Idaho is only 1 1/2 cents per pound greater than the rate from Idaho to Los Angeles.

Idaho now has 40 creameries, 43 cheese factories, 21 canneries, one condensary and a cheese compressing plant. Dairy population comprising nearly one-fifth of the total animal units in the state in 1925.

Sweet Clover Is One of the Best Soil Builders

Sweet clover is one of the best soil builders we can grow for soil building purposes. This does not mean that we should grow it to the exclusion of alfalfa or even red clover, but it does mean that we ought to seed down every acre of small grain with sweet clover that is not being needed in some other legitimate interest for hay, or perhaps at least half of the farmland in Iowa we ought to grow sweet clover for pasture. It should be introduced in the rotation for both pasture and soil building. Let us pay more attention to that crop not for hay, for alfalfa is much superior for that purpose, but as a source for pasture and for the addition of nitrogenous organic matter to the soil.

Light in Scratching Shed

Different practitioners are building their scratching shed or house with one or two small windows at the rear of the house so that the chickens have light to work there. This keeps the dirt worked out from the walls, and amounts to increasing the scratching. If measured and estimated, it will be surprising how much smaller poultry houses are in actual service capacity than their dimensions would seem to indicate.

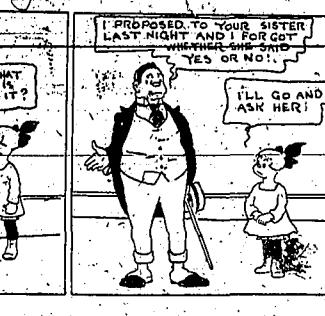
