Talking Machine Is Demonstrated

Before a group of prominent musicians, city officials, educators and music critics Thursday an automatic talking machine which changes its own records and permits of an hour of music without touching the instrument, was demonstrated here for the first time today. The instrument, which is the latest development in the field of musical reproduction, was invented by engineers of the Victor Talking Machine company after two years of intensive experiment.

The demonstration was conducted by Sampson Music company by R. R. Logan, Victor dealer, who announced it as the "fourth revolutionary" development of the Victor company since the fall of 1925.

The moment the instrument was opened and placed in operation, its simplicity and ease of operation were impressed upon the audience.

A dozen records were placed in the magazine, which is suspended at an

angle above the turntable of the instrument. At a turn of the switch controlling the electric current supply, the turntable began to revolve. The mechanical "hand" picked up the first record from the twelve in the magazine and placed it gently upon the revolving turntable. The tone arm swung into playing position, and the needle was lowered to the record with unerring accuracy. And all of these operations were performed silently, surely, and with an exactness that no amount of skill by the human hand could quite duplicate.

Immediately after the needle touched the record, the music began. The record was played to the end, and the needle slid over into the eccentric groove of the record. The sound box was lifted by the remarkable mechanism and moved to the side. Again the mechanical "hand" went smoothly and silently into operation, removed the record that had been completed, and deposited it gently in a felt lined case just below the magazine. The "hand" then continued up to the magazine, picked a dozen records were placed in the magazine, which is suspended at an

arm returned to playing position and the music resumed.

Time after time the operation was performed with unflinching accuracy until the last record had been played, removed from the turntable and deposited in the felt lined revolving drawer. Then the turntable stopped automatically.

The instrument was ready for another selection of twelve records, and another hour of music without attention from the operator. Mr. Logan called attention particularly to the simplicity of design, which requires no experience in operation. The series of gears and cams are completely enclosed, as is the electric motor which operates them. It is practically trouble proof.

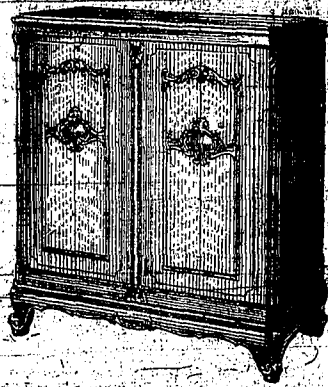
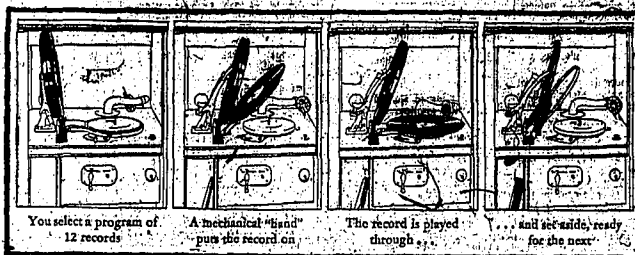

Creamery Men to Hold Institute

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow.—An institute for Idaho creamerymen is to be held this spring for the first time, according to announcement at the department of dairy husbandry here. The institute, which is sponsored by the university, is scheduled for April 12, 13 and 14 at the Cooperative Creamery, Jerome.

The plan is the first definite effort to carry on intensive instructional work among creamerymen. Visitation has been sent to the leading creamery operators in the state and many of them will be on the program to give the benefit of their experience. Roy B. Smith, of the Jerome creamery, will be chairman of the meetings.

Arrangements for the institute are being made by F. W. Atkeson, head of the department of dairy husbandry. H. A. Bendixen, professor of dairy manufacture, will be in active charge at Jerome, and he will be assisted by D. L. Fourt, extension service dairy specialist. Professor Bendixen will discuss the technical phases of creamery operation; other speakers will take up the management phases.

Among the topics to be discussed at the institute are the following: Creaming and holding the patrons' interest, cream grading systems, cream grading and butter judging, the relation of the creamery operator to the producers' problems, common creamery losses, ice-cream manufacture, pasteurization and neutralization, Idaho butter marketing problems, utilization of creamery by-products, and the use of starters in butter making.
