There are two solutions of the "family problem," one is included in the McNary-Haugen bill, calling for Government aid in handling the export surplus. This is needed until the permanent one, which will take some years to work out, can be put in operation.

The permanent solution is not individual co-operation, but business organization. Farming interests are in their present plight because they are using methods 50 years behind the times. It cannot be expected that the present bow-and-arrow mode of farming can successfully compete with the machine-gun system of manufacturing and other industries.

industries.

Permanent presperity will never come to the farmers until they can dictate the selling price of their own product. This they will never succeed in doing until the macketing is controlled by huge billion-dellar corporations. The only successful way for farmers to compete with "big business" is to enter the field of "big business" themselves. Manufacturing has advanced from individual blacksmith shops to great factory organizations; the farming industry must travel the same road.

Will they see the light of "big business" methods before they are forever lost in the swamp of individualism?


