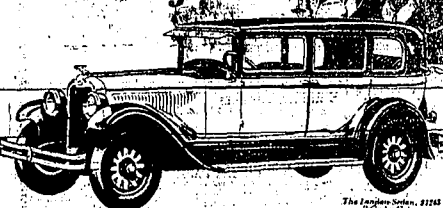

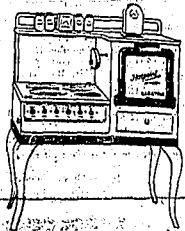

# POULTRY PEN NEWS

### ALWAYS EGGS-ACTLY CORRECT

Poultrymen who have used both sodium fluoride and blue stone for chicken lice say the fluoride is better. It may be used any time of the year as a dip if precaution is taken to keep the birds from catching cold after treatment. Blue stone, always should be used sparingly, especially on chicks. The same is true of the fluoride when used as a powder.

#### NEED UNIFORM RULES FOR CREDIT

The poultry breeding industry of the United States is making a determined effort to bring harmony out of the confusion that now exists because of the rules and regulations applied to certification and accreditation of flocks in the various states.

#### Under present conditions which a prospective purchaser of hatching eggs, baby chicks, or breeding stock cannot across the word "accredited" or "certified" in connection with the advertised flock, he does not know just what factors were taken into consideration to certify or accredit these flocks, unless he is familiar with the regulations governing such work in each state.

At present there are twenty-two states which have adopted regulations for certification and accreditation of flocks. The difference that exists between the regulations in these states is seen in the fact that in some states baby chicks are sold by grade based on the production of the parents; in another case two grades of chicks are offered, one grade based on accreditated flocks that are not tested for bacillary white diarrhea, and the other grade from flocks that have been tested and found free from the disease.

**LIGHTS IN THE HEN HOUSE.**  
"I have found the use of electric lights in the evening the satisfactory way to lengthen out the short winter days. In the morning, Mr. Hoffer, who operates the Iowa laying station, "I have found it necessary to provide a light on a day if high egg production is to be gotten during the winter months. Lengthening the day by turning lights on in the morning has been a failure. It may work out where the weather is not so cold as it is at Des Moines."
