

For a generation these folks have camped as it were on 40,000 acres of the deepest, richest soil in Twin Falls county. Years ago they showed their faith by their works and organized the Murtaugh Irrigation District and voted nearly \$4,000,000 in bonds to finance the project.

They have held meetings, cussed and discussed every phase of the situation, raised money by assessment to pay the expense of keeping the district, alive, and to defend it from unscrupulous sharks who would disorgan-ize it for personil gain. 
