The Power Site Issue

Eleven Reasons Why I Am in Favor of the Development of the Low Line Drop, Power Site as a Water User Under the Twin Falls Canal System.

- 1. Fifteen to 20 per cent of the waste water from use of the 150,000 acre feet necessary for the new project can be picked up by our Twin Falls Canal System and thus increase our water supply to that extent.
2. It will reduce our taxes materially. More valuation means reduction in taxes.
3. It will reduce the indebtedness of the Twin Falls Canal Company immediately by \$100,000.
4. This will represent a savings in interest of approximately \$6,000.00 per year.
5. It will reduce the upkeep and maintenance cost of the drop itself and the cost of cleaning silt out of the canal system below, which is a continual annual expense.
6. It will not change the management of the present canal system in any way whatsoever.
7. No water will be taken from our canals for the new project since the supply will be pumped out of the Snake River above Milner Dam and be distributed through a new canal system of its own.
8. The Government reports show there is only a limited storage in the American Falls Reservoir for sale. Why take a chance on letting this go out of our community?
9. If sold to the Murtaugh Irrigation District this power site can never be acquired by big power interests as it will revert back to the Twin Falls Canal Company if not used for the purpose it is obtained for.
10. It is definitely known from authoritative sources that the Idaho Power company is opposing the sale to Murtaugh Irrigation District and the stockholders of our canal system who are opposing this sale, are rendering aid to the enemy.
11. As proof of the sincerity of the proposal, and refuting any rumor that it is a scheme to "grab" available power sites, the financial agents of the Murtaugh Irrigation district, are willing to advance money for the construction of this power plant at the drop if the canal company will then power at reasonable rates for use on the Murtaugh lands. The canal company, under this arrangement, would have surplus power, either for use or resale.
