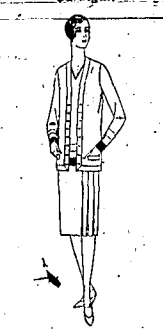

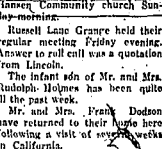

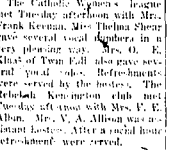

1928 A DEMOCRATIC YEAR

Students of politics cannot help but see the significance of the fact that slowly but surely the Republican party has been losing its momentum on congressional control. At the present time the republican majority is maintained by the barest margin of a few votes.

The almost inevitable outcome of the full elections will be an invasion of Democratic control of congress and a wholesale checking of the ever-mounting cloud of the administration of government affairs and sky-limit taxes.

Taxpayers are much safer when the balance of power is about equally distributed between the dominant political parties. This applies to nation, state, county and municipality.

Idaho is due for a genuine shake-up politically. The cabinet form of state government is not satisfactory to a large number and the never-ceasing climb of expenditures and tax burdens is getting to a point where the voters are going to try a change of some kind, regardless of who may be responsible for the present unsatisfactory conditions.

It is an open secret that the state republican administration will have some very important family matters to thresh out at the next convention and just what the results will be are problematical.

The old machines of both the Democratic and Republican parties lost favor with the rank and file of the more progressive elements in both and this crystallized into the Progressive party. By far the greater number of voters were drawn from the Democratic party in Idaho by the Progressives. This fact of itself is a compliment to the principles of the party, even though disastrous for the time to the party organization.

It will be a matter of good business judgment, as well as good taste for us as Democrats to bear in mind the lesson of the past few years in Idaho.

The Progressive party was composed largely of farmers and those interested in agricultural pursuits, and the organization of the Progressive party in Idaho was a protest against "too much political bossism" and "stem-winder tactics." Added to this was the apparent discrimination against the farmers in the distribution of the tax burden and the desire for a number of much-needed reforms in our election system and other important matters.

The Progressive party would be in power today in Idaho, if there had been any national leadership for the state organization to tie to. Now that there seems to be no remote possibility of a national Progressive party for the present, the Idaho Progressives are going to take their eggs to the political market that offers the best price.

They are not going to be deceived by half-hearted promises and soft soap. Nothing but "all work and a yard wide" methods will have any appeal and the Democratic party certainly can remember the happenings of the past four years well enough to make up their minds that an avalanche of good luck is going to sweep the party in Idaho into power. It will take old-fashioned political strategy, square shooting and fair bargaining to "bring home the bacon" but 1928 is the time to do it, and now is the time to begin.
