MASTER FARMERS

Heretofore the conferring of degrees has been co fined to persons of purely educational attainments, usually as a result of college training. We have had in profusior Masters of Arls, Masters of Science and the like.

But recently a new degree is being conferred, but not formal ceremonies with the recipients in scholastic garb, but as a simple recognition of practical merit is one of the world's basic activities. It is that of Master

During the past year this degree or title has been con-ferred upon successful farmers selected by agricultural journals in 17 states, the qualifications for the honor being stated as follows:

"Those who have maintained and improved the fertillty of their farms through crop rotation, fertilization and the production of livestock; used labor saving equipment; modernized their homes by installing electric lights, running water and other conveniences."

It is a good idea, worth developing until all outstanding farmers in the country have been awarded this recog-uition. In no line of effort is there so great a need for practical leadership as in agriculture. The degree of Mas-ter Farmer, if worthily bestowed, will give a certain dig-nity to the important vocation of farming, and will point out those who receive it as conspicuous examples for emulation.

By all means let us have more Master Farmers.


