



# Wants for the Home

Welcome the new tinted damasks, all 22 housekeepers! The lesser crests and spots that affect the family table now plentiful gathered on these charming colored cloths—and this means a great saving of labor, especially where there are little folk.

The pastel tints of the new linens bring a delightful note of color into the dining room, where we appreciate cheerful appointments more than in any other room.

Preserving Dainties and Tooth-brushes  
Snak a new broom in hot salt water. The brooms become stiffer and wear longer. Sew tooth-brushes soaked in hot salt water will last twice as long.

For Burns and Insect Bites  
The damp salt to kill the pain of burns, insect bites, and scratches. Moisten the affected parts immediately after a burn, or sting and cover with a thick coat of salt. This will remove the pain and soothe.

For Gardeners  
A little salt added to the water in which they are kept will make cut flowers keep longer. Strong brine thrown around quince trees will cause them to bloom and bear in a remarkable way. Salt straw over asparagus beds, generally, will kill weeds and serve as fertilizer.

Obnoxious weeds may be killed by covering the stalks with salt. Salt sprinkled over the ground will keep down weeds. Snails and earthworms can be killed by sprinkling salt on the sidewalks and damp corners where they thrive.

How to Clean Silver at Once  
Put a few grains of salt in a bowl with water, adding to each quart 1 teaspoon salt and 1 of baking soda. Keep water boiling, placing in a basket of tacks a piece of new aluminum wire such as a pin or rod. Place silver in a wire so each piece touches the aluminum or another piece of silver in contact with it. Soak 4 minutes, remove silver to hot suds, wash off tacks and dry.

Every woman wants to know how to capture the charm of color in her home. Miss Adams, of Wright's, a famous authority on interior decoration effects, has written a magazine article, under the title of "The Colorful Home," which has been released. It is an interesting contribution, and in this article she says:

"To capture the charm of color in your home, to select, discard, combine, contrast the infinite variety of shades which are at your command—this is a part of the art of interior decoration."

"The first, take into consideration the color of your bed. The north room must have a warm, warm color. The bedroom which is normally flooded with sunlight should have more subdued tones."

"Second, take stock of the furnishings and decorations which are already in the room. Perhaps that color will be in the rug, the wallpaper, the color you are planning to apply to the bed."

"Fourth, when you have selected the dominating tone and have fixed it either in drapery, wall paper or rug or curtains, build the rest of your color scheme around this dominating tone. Let harmonizing shades predominate with one spot of contrast."

"Many color combinations for different types of rooms are simple, practical, and easy to execute. I recommend that you get a color chart and plan your decorating with the aid of these rich shades."

"There is a suggestion for a color palette to be finished in this material. Have pale green walls and yellow curtains sprinkled with small flower motifs in rose and green. The woodwork should be of grey green obtained by mixing blue green with twenty-five part French grey. The beds may be of French grey bordered with a thin stripe of coral rose and the dressing table of coral rose with different types of blue and green. Have the chairs of French grey with small rose cushions with floral patterns. Wall and ceiling lamps with yellow shades and boudoir lamp with rose shade, complete the ensemble."

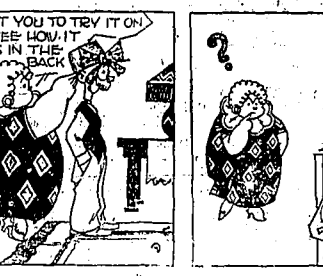

### THE COUNTY HOSPITAL

Syracuse, a city of 220,000, recently put on a campaign to raise \$2,500,000 for one hospital; Pittsburgh, a city of 583,000 for \$1,500,000; Cincinnati, a city of 401,000 for \$600,000; Glen Cove, N. Y., a city of 24,000, for \$1,000,000; Winchester, Mass., a city of only 10,000, raised \$232,000 in a recent campaign for its hospital.

It is proposed that this county vote next fall on whether the county shall keep or sell the hospital.

### EASTER OBSERVANCE

Easter Sunday this year fell on April 8, exactly midway between the earliest and latest possible dates established for this important Christian festival, which may occur as early as March 22 or as late as April 25.

Strictly speaking, the observance of Easter was an innovation introduced into the church calendar more than a hundred years after the ministry of Christ, being a continuation or outgrowth of the Jewish Passover.

There is no trace of the observance of Easter as a Christian festival recorded in the New Testament or in writings of the apostolic fathers. Neither Christ nor his apostles enjoined the keeping of this or any other particular feast. The early Christians, being derived principally from the Jewish church, continued to observe the old Jewish festivals, hence their Passover was perpetuated in the spirit of their religion and eventually became the feast we now celebrate as Easter.

The date of Easter observance was the subject of some of the most bitter controversies which rent the early church, at one time no less than three different dates having been observed in the same year by various branches. The very name of Easter is from the old Teutonic goddess of spring.

But, however originated, Easter commemorates the central basis of the Christian religion, the resurrection of Christ, and has been observed from very early times with strictness and elaborate ceremonial, coupled with many curious and interesting popular customs, among which the sending of paschal eggs is one of most universal.

This custom, in turn, is derived from pagan sources, the egg being known to the ancients as a symbol of immortality.

### BIG FARMER POOL

Cooperative marketing of products has made steady progress among Canadian farmers and the results have been generally satisfactory. Among the successful enterprises of this nature is the Canadian Wheat Pool, according to A. J. McPhail, president of the selling agency of the organization.

Like many other similar projects, this pool is the result of years of effort in education and organization, extending over a quarter of a century. These efforts have finally resulted in securing wide support for the wheat pool, not only by the farmers, but by business and professional men as well, according to Mr. McPhail.

In a recent address he declared that the farmers of western Canada "will never surrender the control they now exercise over the merchandising of their own grain."

Although cooperative marketing among farmers everywhere has generally been faced with many obstacles, chief among which have been the skepticism and indifference of the farmers themselves, the idea underlying it is sound.

Wherever loyalty of the pool's membership has been combined with a capable selling organization, the advancement of the enterprise has generally been gratifying. Within a few years it is believed that the cooperative marketing plan will gain unanimous approval among really progressive and business-like farmers.

### COLOR SCHEME FOR THE PORCH

If car is left unattended, labels must be set, motor stopped, and car turned to light.

It is also necessary to have a license, and responsibility of driver. Ranpeter said on down grade that he must have gear of such size as to be ready and check of license, to vehicle upon a license. Any car involved in an accident resulting in injury or death must stop at the scene of such accident. If involved in an accident, the driver must stop, and give name, address, license number, and other information, and must be able to produce official license within 24 hours. Ranpeter reports cases brought for a case which were involved in any other accidents or struck by any other, within 24 hours, and must give all necessary information.

### Vehicle

Vehicle. No vehicle is to exceed 8 feet in width by the outside, nor a height of 14 feet. The load to be carried by a vehicle is to be extended more than 6 feet from the front. No load is to extend the line of the front end to the left side, and not beyond 6 inches over the fender on the right side. Loads extending 4 feet or more at back of car must display red flag in the day time and red light at night.

Brakes. Brakes must be in good repair, and must have 2 separate means of applying same, each of which must be effective. Horns and Warning Devices. Vehicles must be equipped with a horn in good working condition, audible at least 200 feet. Automobiles must have 2 or more in any unincorporated towns.

Mirrors. Mirrors are essential for every vehicle, as constructed, and driver cannot view highway at night.

Windshields. Windshields must be unobstructed. Signs, posters, etc., must be kept off.

Lighting. Each vehicle, including wagons, buggies, and the like, must have lights (accruals at least 200 feet away. Automobiles must have 2 headlights. Motorcycles must have at least 1 headlight. Motor vehicles must have rear light, visible at least 500 feet back, so placed.
