





Haif the money collected from fines in those states goes to the sheriffs' offices. The more money, the more criminals apprehended and in turn the more fines, with which to detect further lawbreakers.

What is the situation in Idaho?

All the money from fines in the county goes to the pub-lic school fund; half the money collected in policy courts goes to the school funds and the other half to the munici-

Under the present system, taxes, and taxes alone must supply the money for operating such offices as that of the sheriff and, rightly or wrongly, complaint is made when such officials seem to be "spending too much money," Fines should help defray the cost of getting the criminals who pay them.

And here is another argument in favor of diverting some of this money to law enforcement work: as much as we all love our school system, it certainly is a tax enter. Perhaps it is worth it, but regardless of that, the schools should be able to worry along without all this money from flies; for the reason that there is the regular school district assessment; of the \$1,09 levy on each \$100 valuation in this county last year 54 cents went to the general school funds of the current county expense, a part of this is for school operation and the same thing applies to the state current expense levy.




