

-- ASSOCIATIONS AIDING DAIRY INDUSTRY

Through a strong group of cooperative cowtesting as sprintions, bull associations and dairy calf clubs, the re sociations, bull associations and dairy call clubs, the re-sult of several years concerted constructive building, Ida-ho is developing a dairy industry which is setting the pace in-wastern dairying. The testing and breeding associa-tions and the call clubs stand as monuments to the far-signteedness of Idaho's progressive dairymen, who, with cooperation of the agricultural extension division of the University of Idaho college of agriculture, have laid a foundation capable of expansion to meet Idaho's share of the demand which will come as population grows along the Pacific Const. The extension service helps dairy farmers with their technical problems in testing and bull asso-ciations and through practical field dairy schools and the county agent staff brings to them latest knowledge in

county agent start orings to men intest knowledge in dairy operation. Success in dairying depends upon keeping profitable cows, says D. L. Fourt, field dairyman with the University apricultural extension division. The testing associations, breeding groups and calf clubs are holping idalio's dairy farmers to develop the type that will be profitable. The last farm census showed the state's average dairy cow produced but 4450 pounds of milk and 187 pounds of butterfat a year. A survey of records of cows enrolled in test ing associations, in which the low producers are culled and the remaining ones given extra care, show an average production of 7337 pounds of milk and 305 pounds of butterfat, or 2887 pounds of milk and 127 pounds of butterfut more than the average cow. Sold at 40 cents per pound this additional butterfut would return \$50.80 a year per cow more for the association cow than for the average

Dairymen who are shaping their operation to build ner unit production have all facts on their side. Mr. Fourt recently analyzed the relationship of butterfut produc-tion to income over feed cost. He found that a cow pro-ducing only 75 pounds of fut or less per year failed by ducing only 76 pounds of fat or less per year failed by about \$15 to return enough pay for her feed. A 100-pound hitterfat cow returned about \$12 over feed coats while a cow producing 200 pounds of butterfat exceeded feed coats by \$63. The 300 pound cow produced a product worth \$86 more finan feed cost* while a 400 pound cow broduced a product worth \$120 more than feed charges. Should a cow produce 500 pounds of butterfat in a year she will return about \$150 more feed costs.
