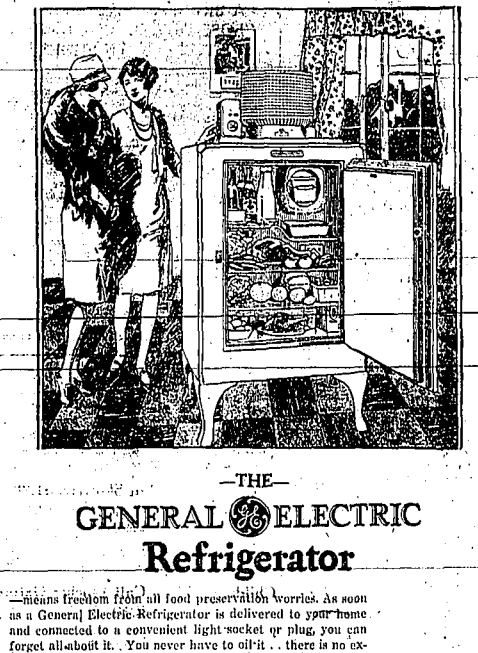

Such monopolistic aggregations should be dissolved and the antitrust laws should be enforced against them..."

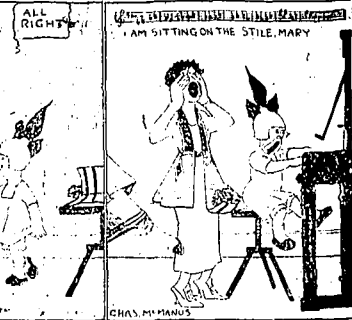
