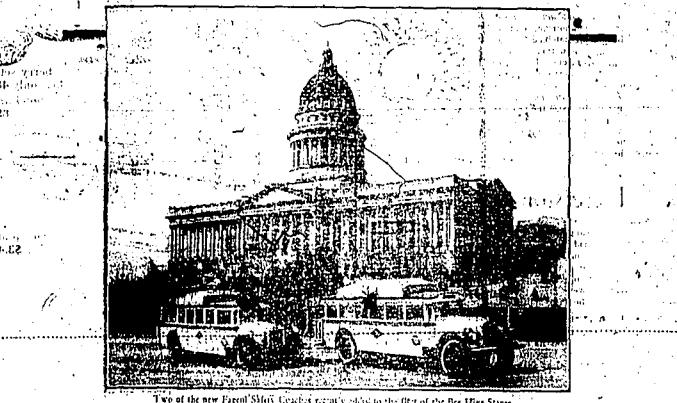

It is to stabilize the price, with the result that the commodity is scarce and is in the hands of a few people. It is the function of a cooperative association to market its commodity in an orderly manner and it is one of the functions of the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank to assist in this program."

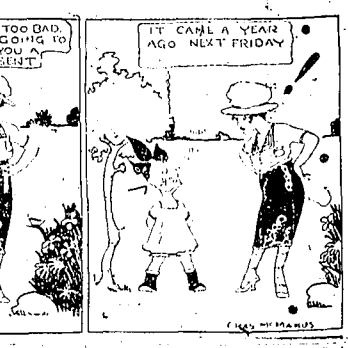
